Mission, Functions, and Goals of the Commission

I. Mission

"The South Carolina Commission on Higher Education will promote quality and efficiency in the state system of higher education with the goal of fostering economic growth and human development in South Carolina."

II. Roles and Functions

- A. To provide pertinent information about higher education to parents and students and to promote access to higher education.
- B. To review and approve new degree program proposals and evaluate existing academic programs.
- C. To develop and maintain a process by which annual appropriation requests are based on institutional performance and to submit these and capital improvement requests to the Budget and Control Board and the General Assembly.
- D. To administer state, regional, and federal programs affecting South Carolina higher education.
- E. To maintain a statewide planning and institutional effectiveness system.
- F. To monitor implementation and evaluate the effectiveness of programs designed to provide minority groups with access to and equality of higher education opportunities.
- G. To examine and license non-public educational institutions.
- H. To make recommendations by means of data collection, research, and studies to the Governor, the Budget and Control Board, and the General Assembly regarding policies, roles, operations, and structure of South Carolina's higher education institutions.
- I. To maintain statewide higher education data collection.
- J. To establish procedures for the transferability of courses at the undergraduate level between two-year and four-year institutions.
- K. To coordinate with the State Board of Education in determining minimum academic expectations and requirements and approving appropriate secondary courses for prospective post-secondary students.
- L. To review minimum undergraduate admissions standards for in-state and out-of-state students.
- M. To reduce, expand, or consolidate, and beginning July 1, 1999, close any institution which does not meet the standards of achievement enumerated in Section 59-103-30 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina.
- N. To review and approve each institutional mission statement to ensure it is within the overall mission of that particular type of institution as stipulated by Section 59-103-15 and is within the overall mission of the state.

III. Goals

- A. To make South Carolina a global leader by working with business and industry to foster higher education's role in economic growth and human development.
- B. To maintain positive relations with the Governor, the Legislature, state agencies, parents, and students and to provide them and the general public with accurate information on South Carolina higher education.
- C. To present the needs and develop support for appropriate funding of public colleges and universities.
- D. To address strategic issues in public and private higher education as they are identified and to ensure a continuous process of assessment and improvement in the colleges and universities.
- E. To assure access to and equality of educational opportunity among minority groups in South Carolina higher education.
- F. To promote quality and diversity in the academic offerings of institutions of higher learning.
- G. To prevent and eliminate unnecessary duplication of degree programs among the state's institutions.
- H. To expand postsecondary educational opportunities for South Carolina residents, to recognize student achievement, and to encourage excellence in teaching and research by administering various higher education programs.
- I. To ensure that non-public educational institutions, other than those exempted in the statutes, are legitimate educational enterprises and that they are fulfilling their purposes.

ENROLLMENT

Glossary

American Indian or Alaskan Native - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America and who maintains cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community recognition.

Asian or Pacific Islander - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, the Indian Subcontinent, or Pacific Islands. This includes people from China, Japan, Korea, the Philippine Islands, American Samoa, India, and Vietnam.

Black, African American - A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa (except those of Hispanic origin).

Hispanic - A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

Nonresident Alien - A person who is not a citizen or national of the United States and who is in this country on a visa or temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely.

White, Non-Hispanic - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa, or the Middle East (except those of Hispanic origin).

Race/ethnicity Unknown - This category is used ONLY if the student did not select a racial/ethnic designation, and the postsecondary institution finds it impossible to place the student in one of the aforementioned racial/ethnic categories during established enrollment procedures or in any post-enrollment identification or verification process.

First-Professional Student - A student enrolled in any of the following degree programs: Chiropractic, Dentistry, Law, Medicine, Optometry, Osteopathic Medicine, Pharmacy, Podiatry, Theology, and Veterinary Medicine.

First-Time Freshman - An entering freshman who has never attended a college (or other postsecondary institution). Includes students enrolled in the fall term who attended college for the first time in the prior summer term. Also includes students who entered with advanced standing (college credits earned before graduation from high school).

Undergraduate Student - A student enrolled in a 4- or 5-year bachelor's degree program and associate's degree program, or a vocational or technical program below the baccalaureate.

Graduate Student - A student taking courses offered for credit toward a master's or doctoral degree.

Transfer Student - A student entering the reporting institution for the first time but known to have previously attended a postsecondary institution at the same level (e.g., undergraduate, graduate). The student may transfer with or without credit.

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Student Enrollment - Calculated as fifteen (15) credit hours per semester for an undergraduate student, twelve (12) credit hours per semester for a graduate level 1 (master's) student, and nine (9) credit hours per semester for graduate level 2 (doctoral) students. First professional pharmacy hours are fifteen (15) credit hours per semester and first professional law are fourteen (14) credit hours per semester. Medicine and Dentistry use the headcount rather than credit hours.

Lower Division - Freshmen and sophomores.

Upper Division - Juniors and seniors.

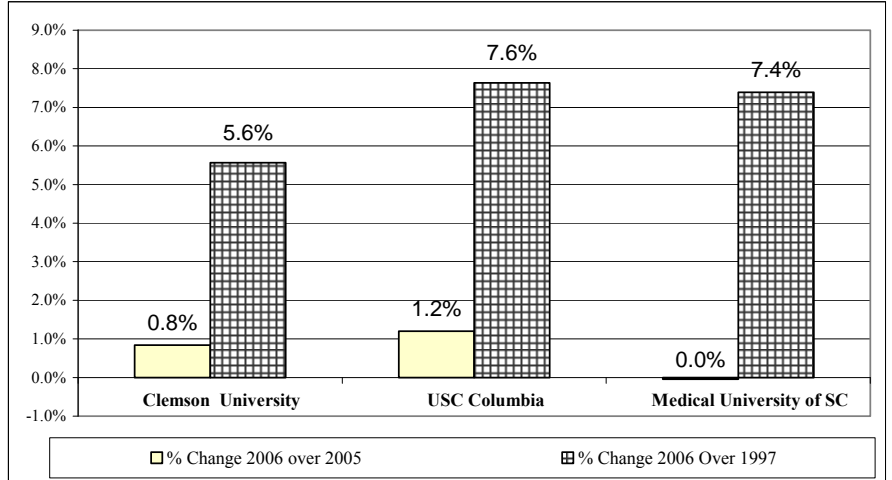

Percent Change - Total Headcount Enrollment Fall 2006 over Fall 2005 and Fall 1997

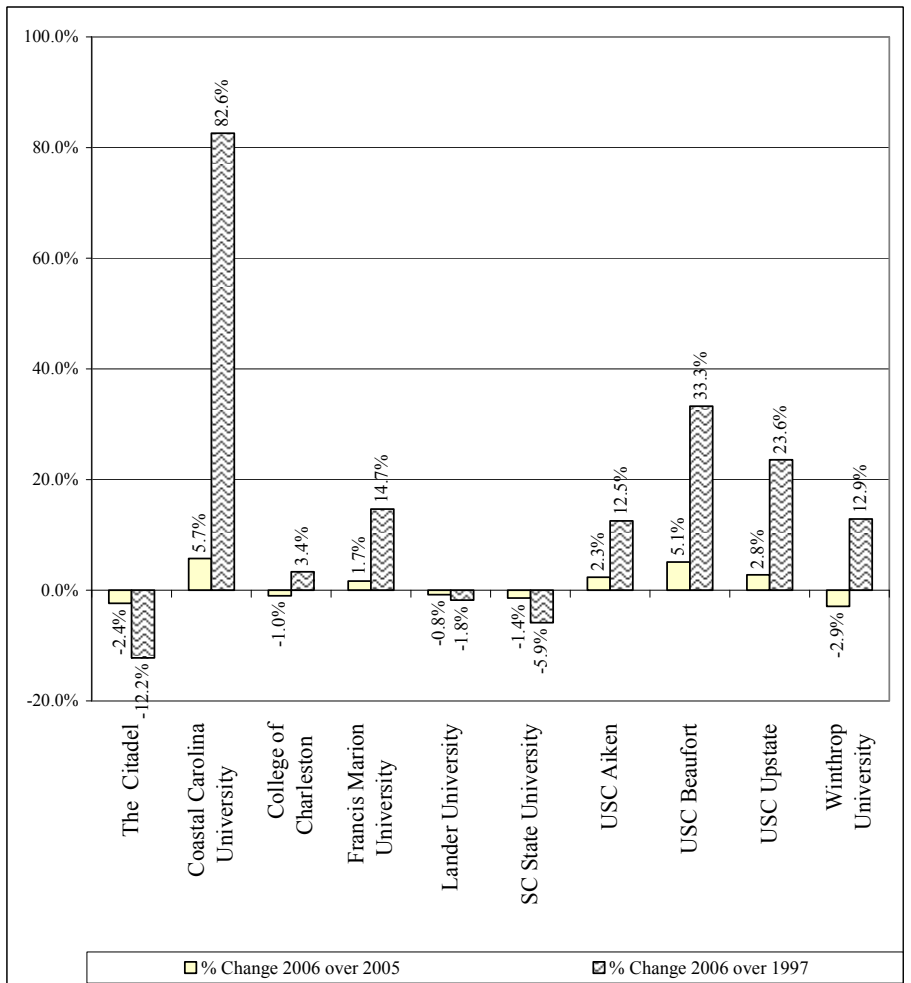

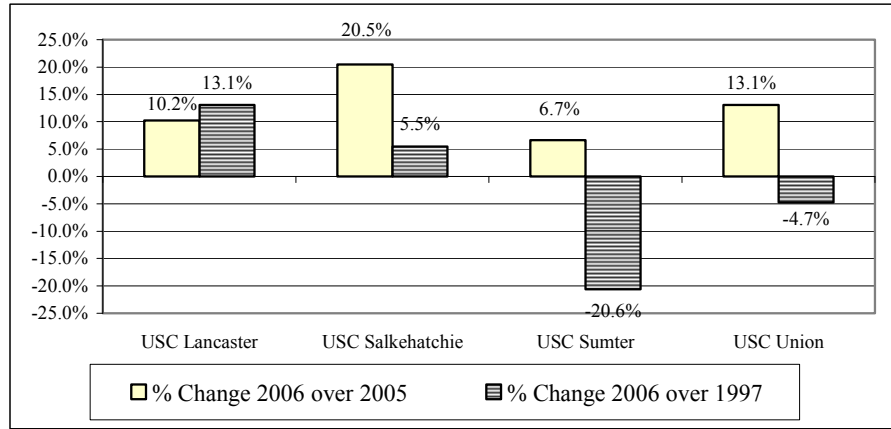

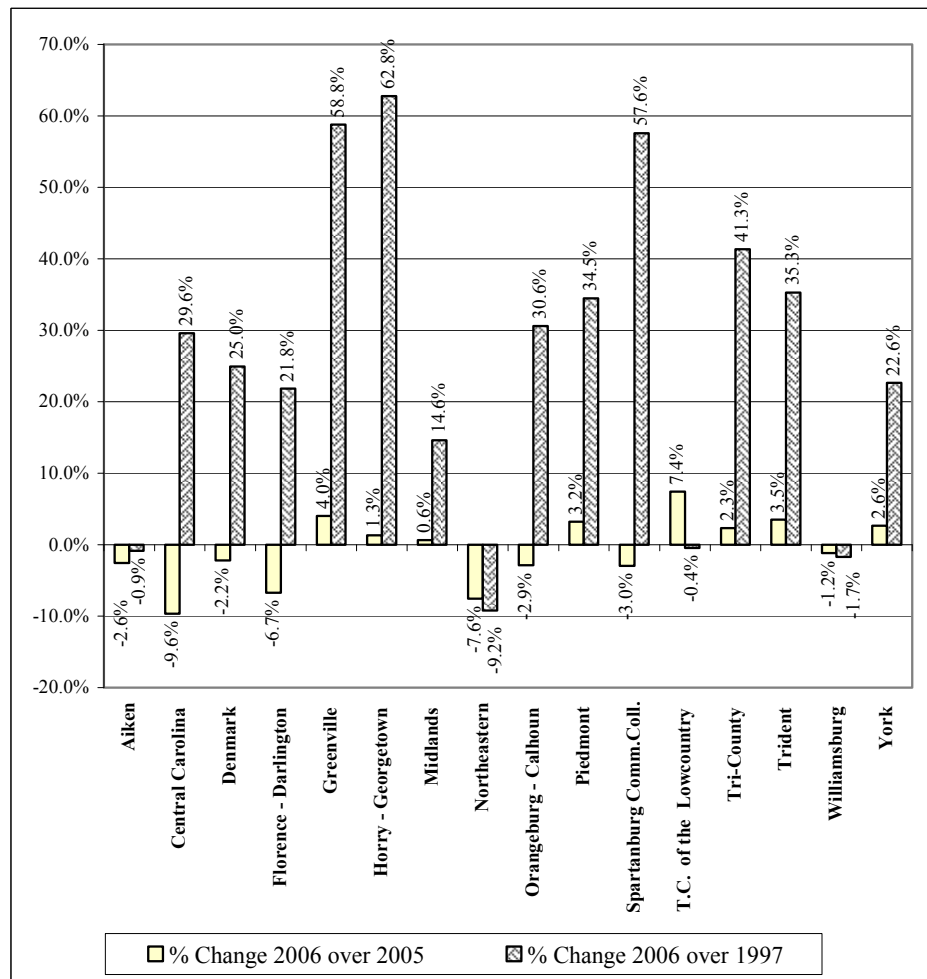


Percent Change - Total Headcount Enrollment Fall 2006 over Fall 2005 and Fall 1997

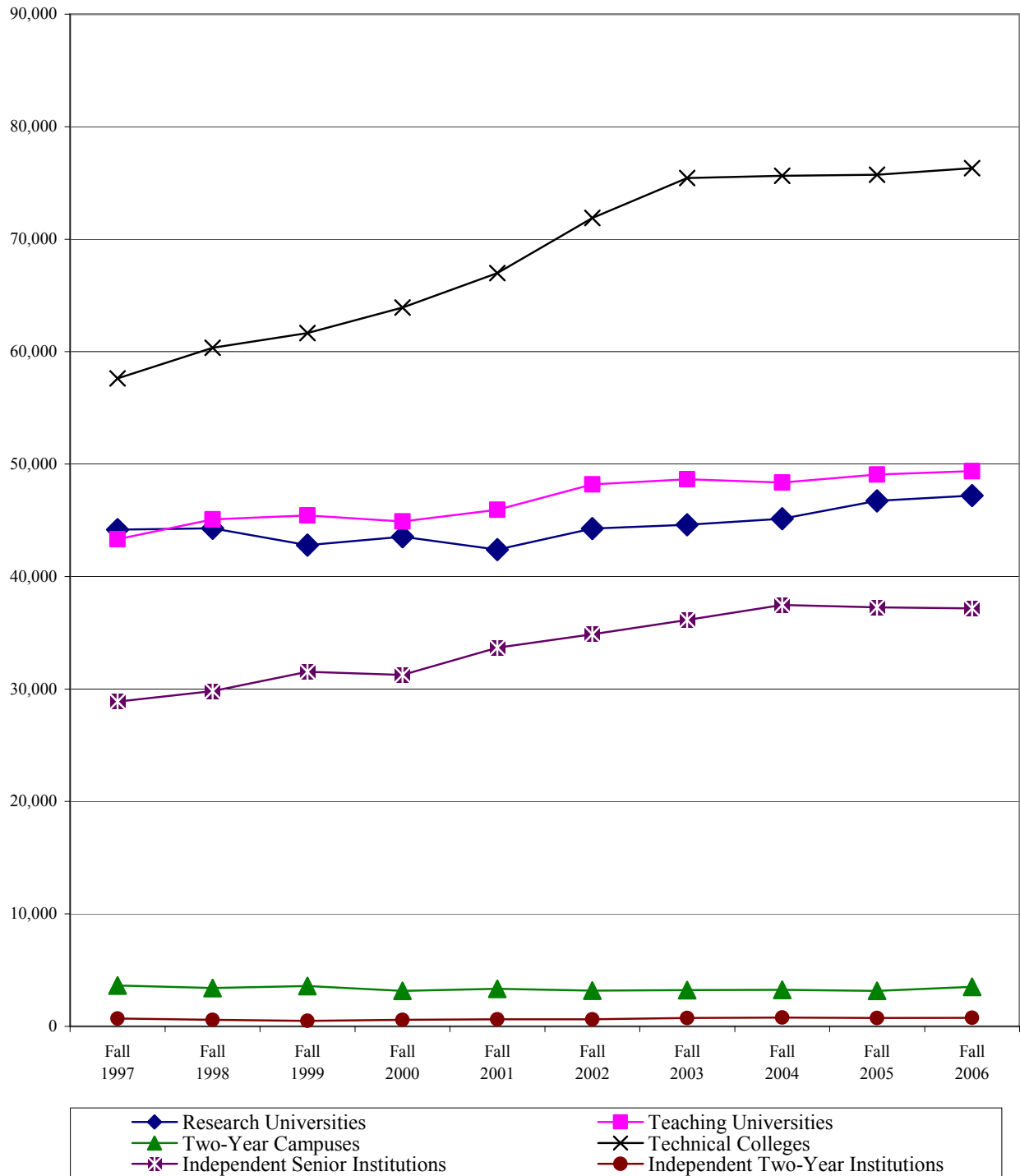

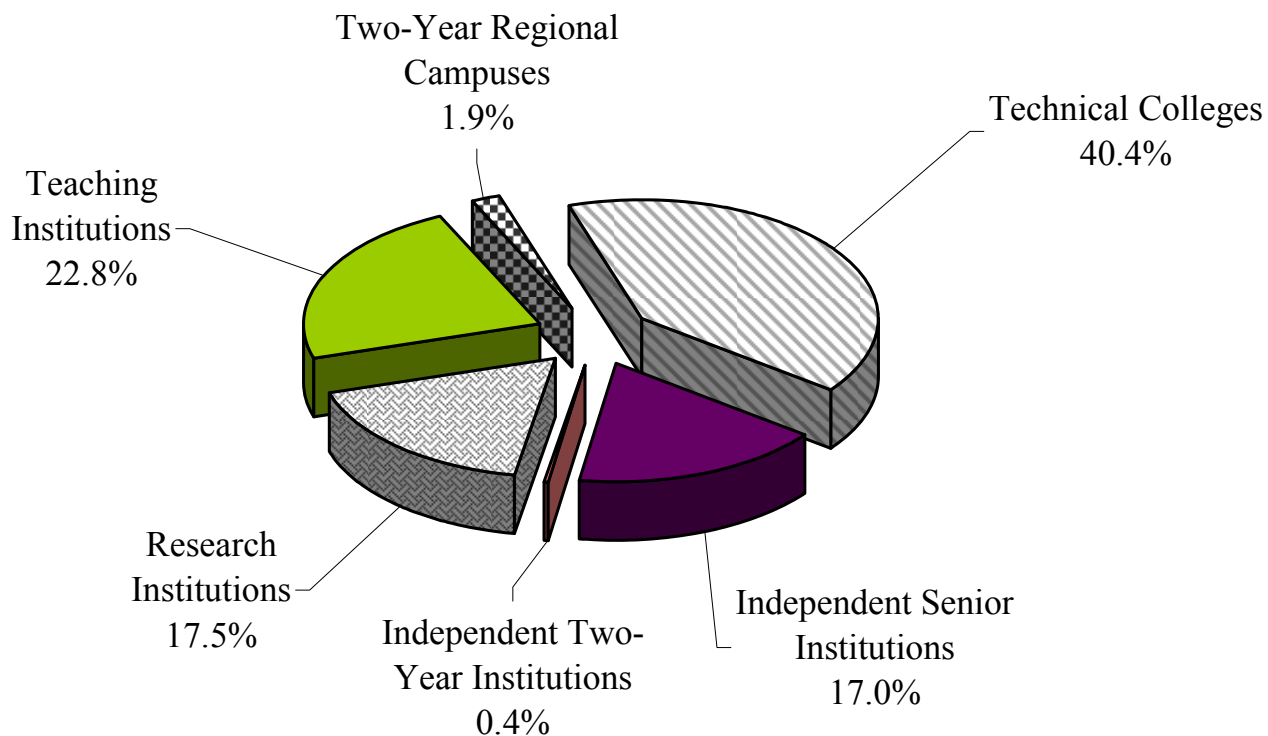

Ten-Year Analysis of S.C. Colleges & Universities Total Headcount Enrollment by Sector



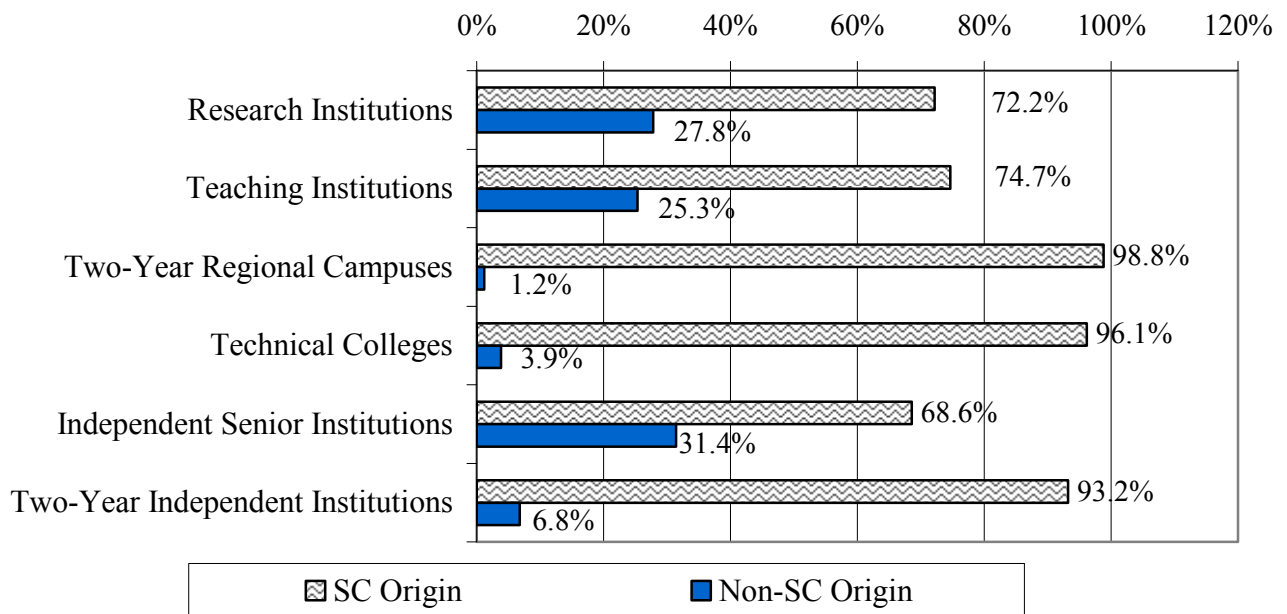

Fall 2006 Opening Headcount Enrollment Undergraduates

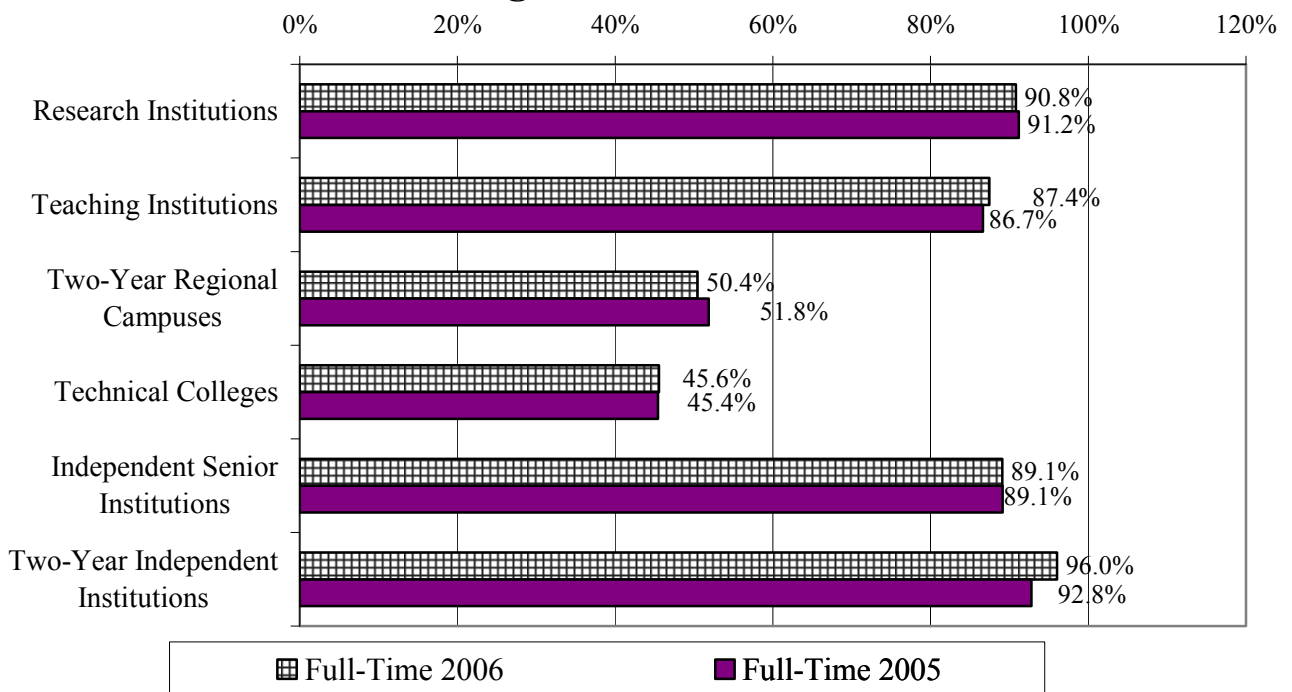

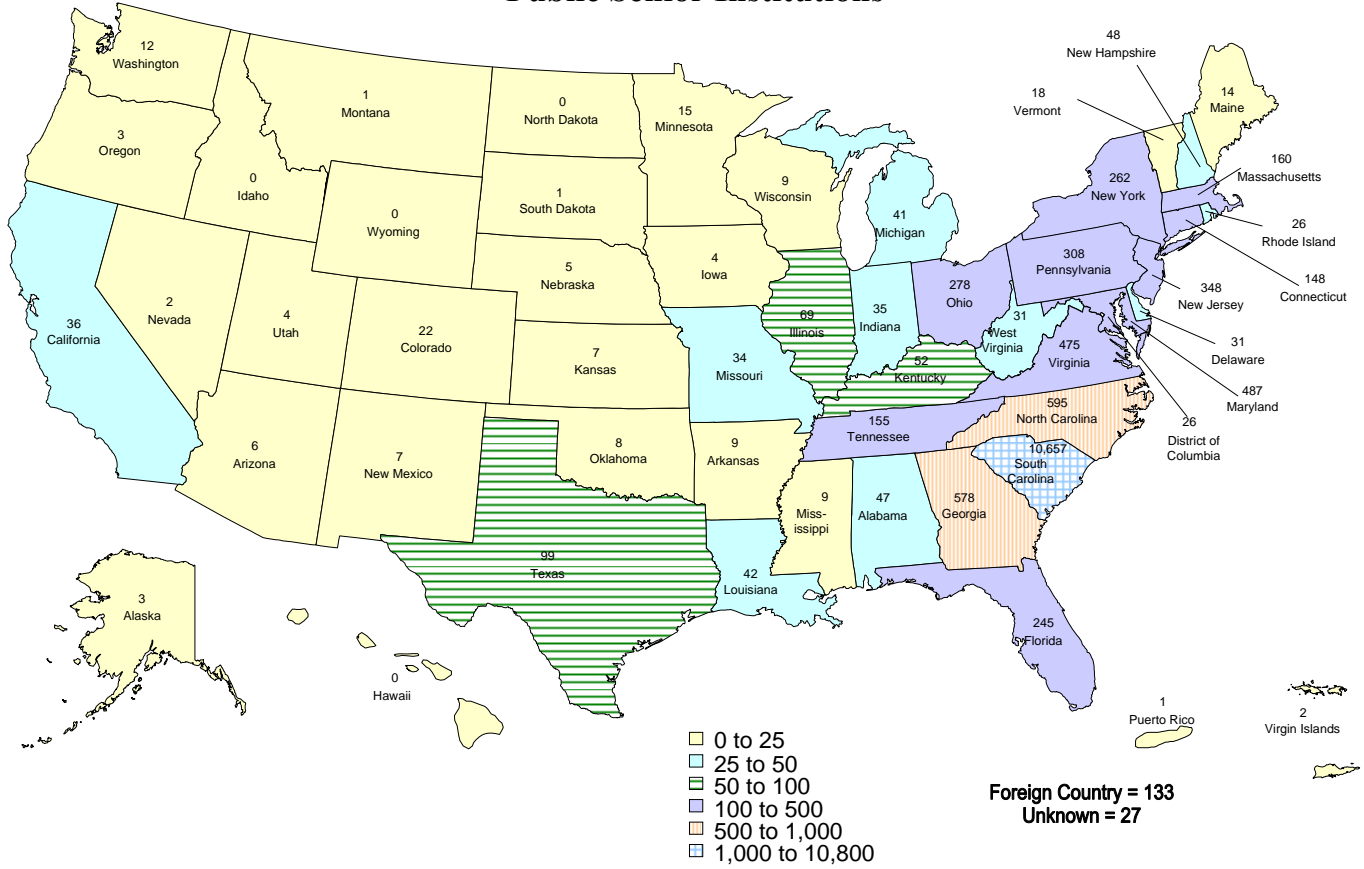

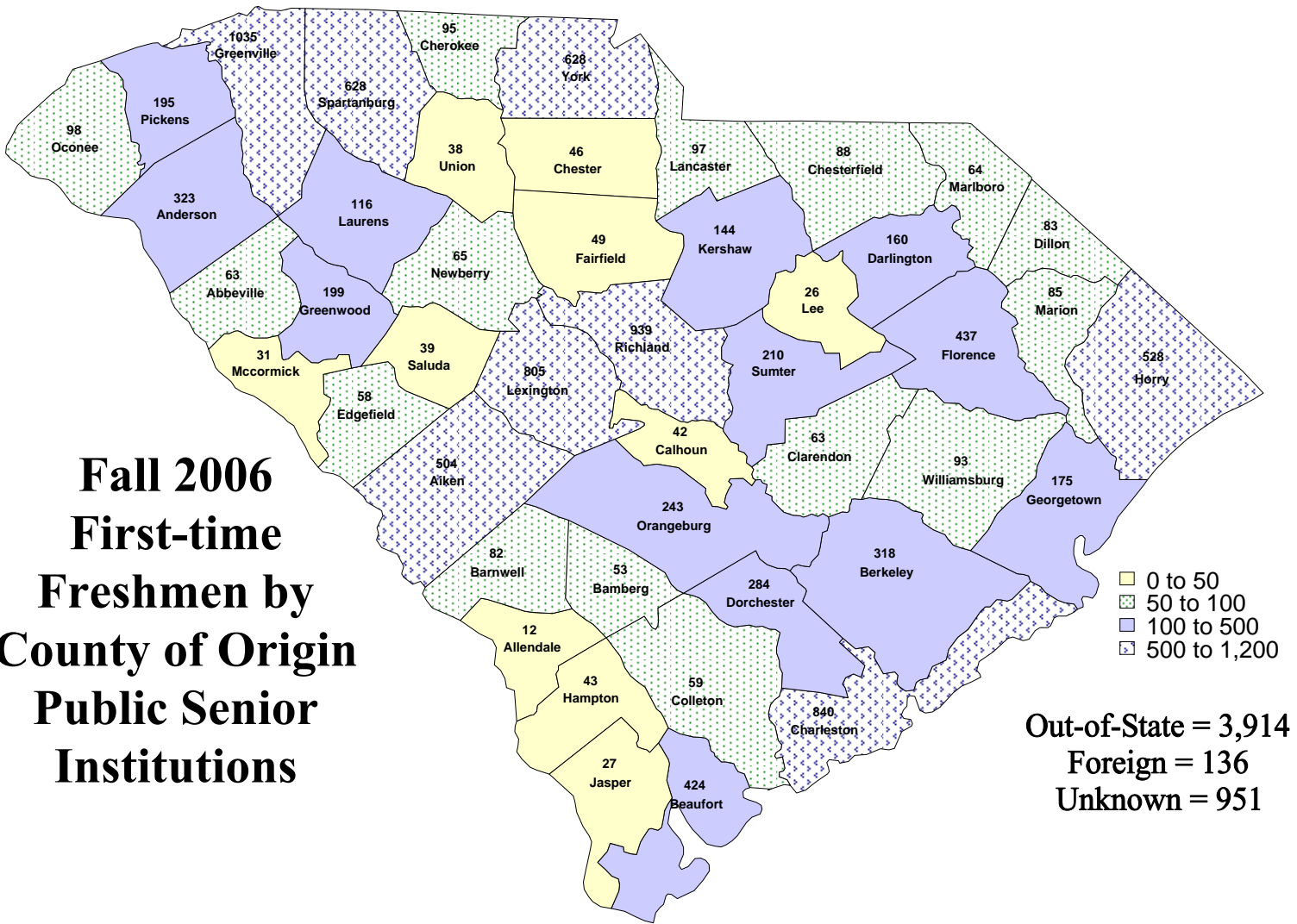
Fall 2006 State of Origin of First-Time Freshmen Public Senior Institutions

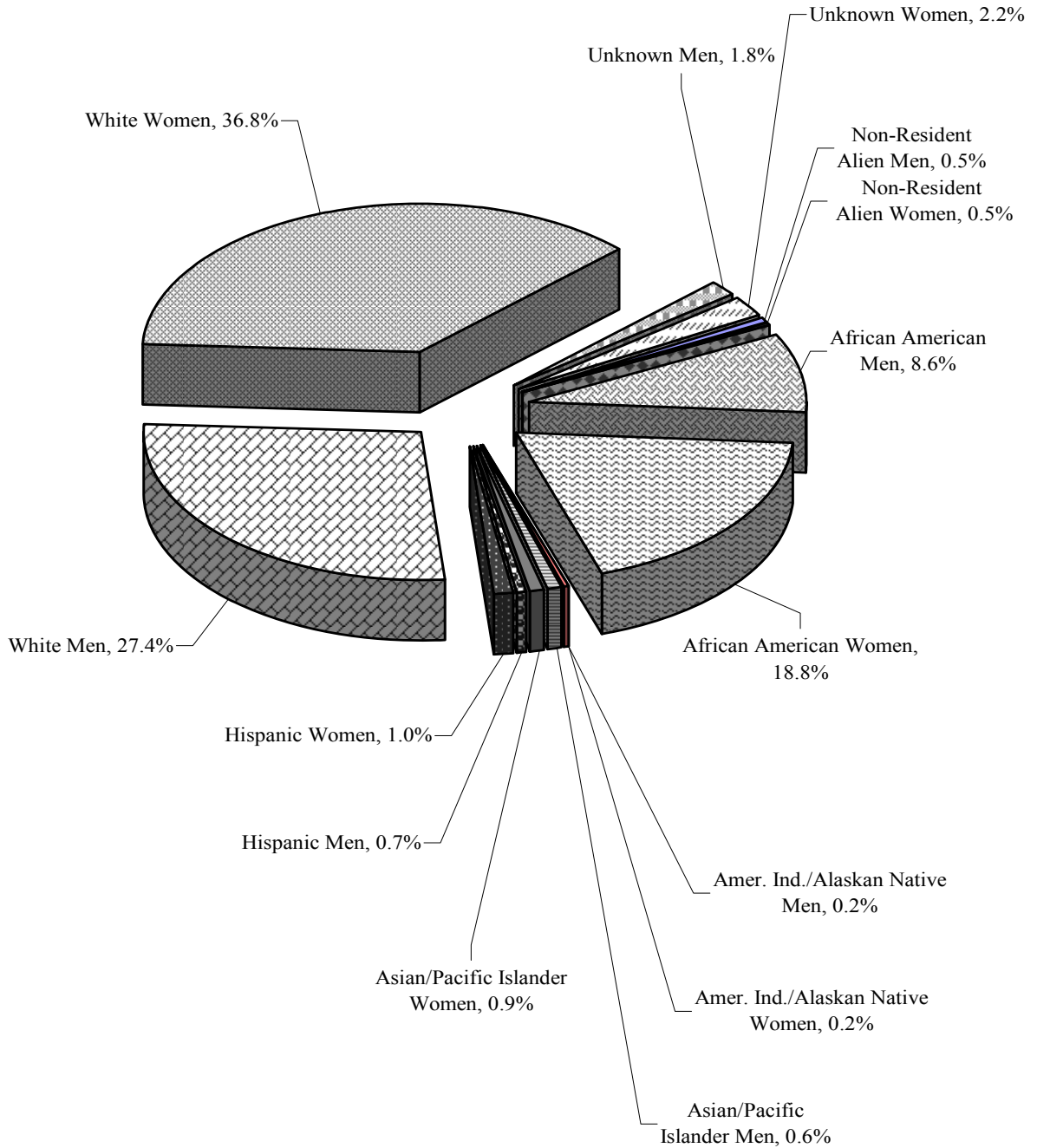

How South Carolina Measures Up Internationally

Participation*

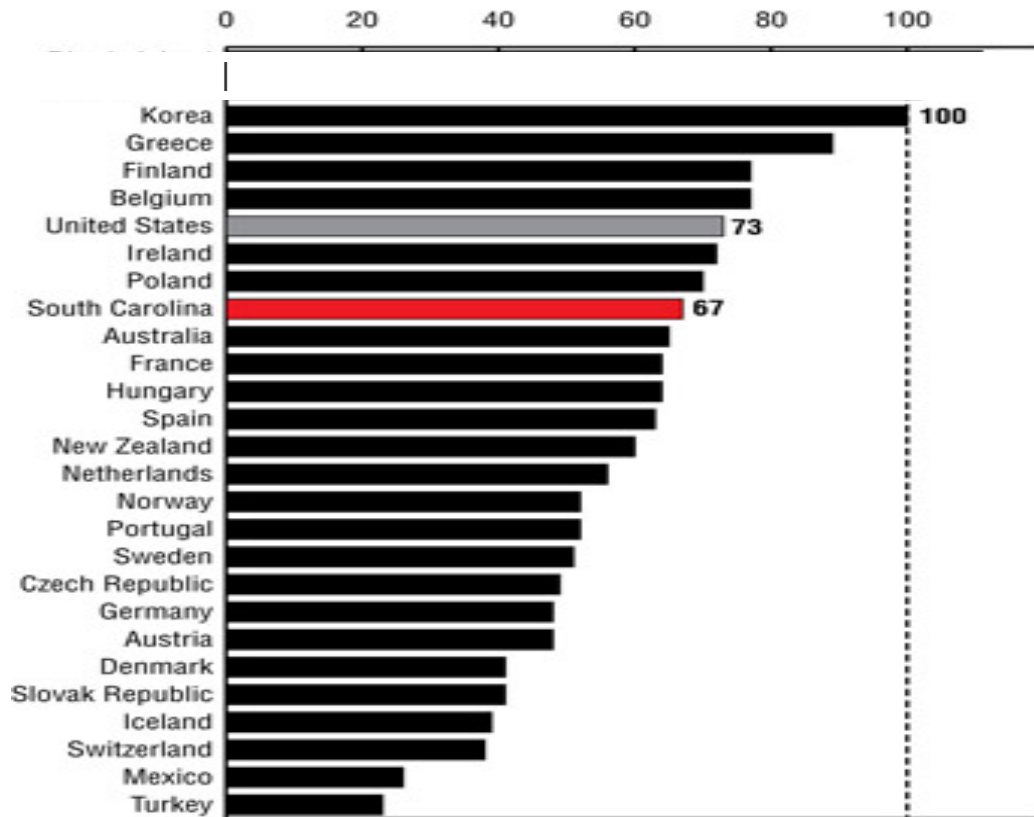


Figure 1. Percent of Young Adults (Ages 18-24) Currently Enrolled in College, 2003

About 33% of young adults, ages 18 to 24, in South Carolina are currently enrolled in college. Although South Carolina's enrollment rate compares well internationally, it represents only 67% of the rate in Korea, the best-performing nation on this measure. South Carolina is also surpassed by Greece, Finland, Belgium, Ireland, and Poland (see figure 1).

*This measure includes both undergraduate and graduate enrollment.

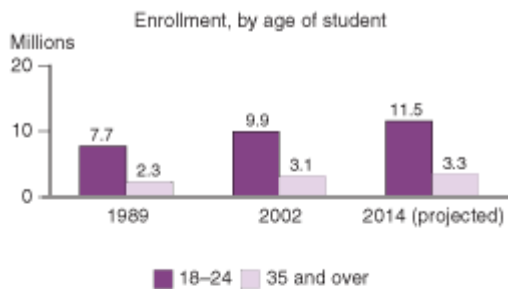

Enrollment by age of student

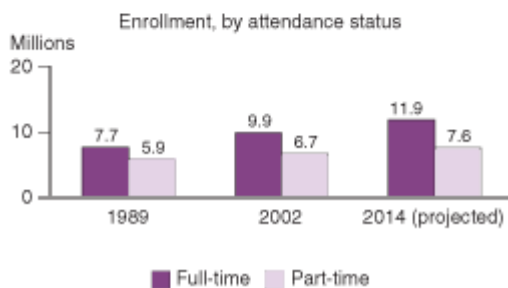

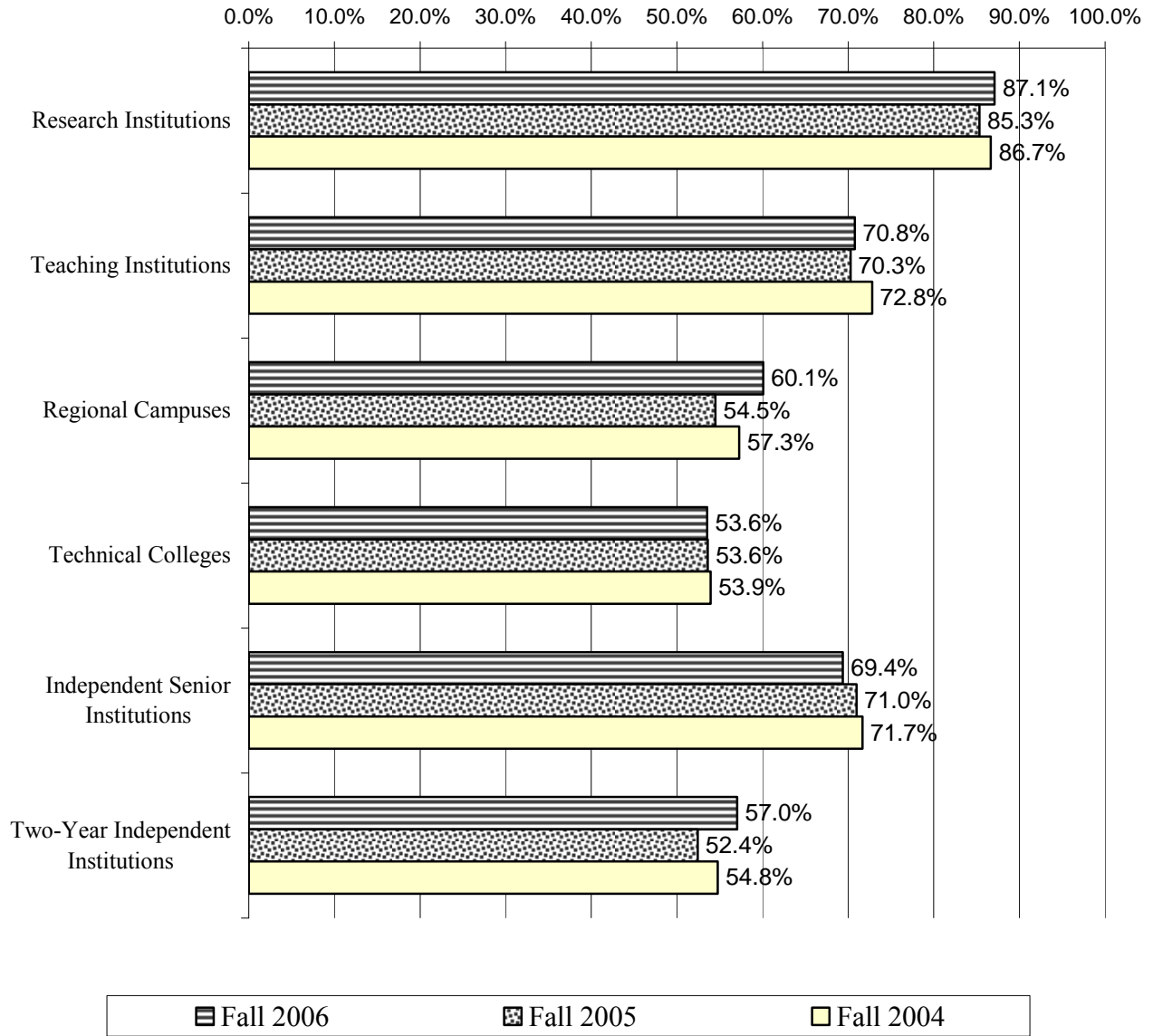

IPEDS (Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System) defines a transfer student as one entering the reporting institution for the first time but known to have previously attended a postsecondary institution at the same level (e.g., undergraduate, graduate). The student may transfer with or without credit.

DEGREES AWARDED

Glossary

Degree – An award conferred by a college, university, or other postsecondary education institution as official recognition for the successful completion of a program of study.

Diploma – A formal document certifying the successful completion of a prescribed program of study. Award conferred by a college, university, or other postsecondary education institution as official recognition.

Certificate – A formal award certifying the satisfactory completion of a postsecondary education program.

Associate's Degree – An award that normally requires at least two but less than four years of full-time equivalent college work.

Bachelor's Degree – An award (baccalaureate or equivalent degree, as determined by the Secretary, U.S. Department of Education) that normally requires at least four but NOT more than five years of full-time equivalent college-level work. This includes ALL bachelor's degrees conferred in a five-year cooperative (work-study plan) program.

Master's Degree – An award that requires the successful completion of a program of study of at least the full-time equivalent of one but not more than two academic years of work beyond the bachelor's degree.

Doctoral Degree – The highest award a student can earn for graduate study. The doctor's degree classification includes such degrees as Doctor of Education, Doctor of Juridical Science, Doctor of Public Health, and the Doctor of Philosophy degree in any field such as agronomy, food technology, education, engineering, public administration, ophthalmology, or radiology. For the Doctor of Public Health degree, the prior degree is generally earned in the closely related professional field of medicine or in sanitary engineering.

First-Professional Degree – An award that requires completion of a program that meets all of the following criteria: (1) completion of the academic requirements to begin practice in the profession; (2) at least two years of college work prior to entering the program; and (3) a total of at least six academic years of college work to complete the degree program, including prior required college work plus the length of the professional program itself. First-professional degrees may be awarded in the following ten fields: Chiropractic, Dentistry, Medicine, Optometry, Osteopathic Medicine, Pharmacy, Podiatry, Veterinary Medicine, Law and Theology.

CIP (Classification of Instructional Programs) – A NCES (National Center of Education Statistics) publication that provides a numerical classification and standard terminology for secondary and postsecondary instructional programs.

Credit Hour – A unit of measure that represents an hour of instruction that can be applied to the total number of hours needed for completing the requirements of a degree, diploma, certificate or other formal award.

Credit Course – A course that, if successfully completed, can be applied toward the number of courses required for achieving a degree, diploma, certificate, or other formal award.

Degree-Seeking Students – Students enrolled in courses for credit who are recognized by the institution as seeking a degree or formal award. At the undergraduate level, this is intended to include students enrolled in vocational or occupational programs.

Graduation rate – The rate required for disclosure and/or reporting purposes under Student Right-to-Know. This rate is calculated as the total number of completers within 150% of normal time divided by the revised cohort minus any allowable exclusions.

How South Carolina Measures Up Internationally

Completion

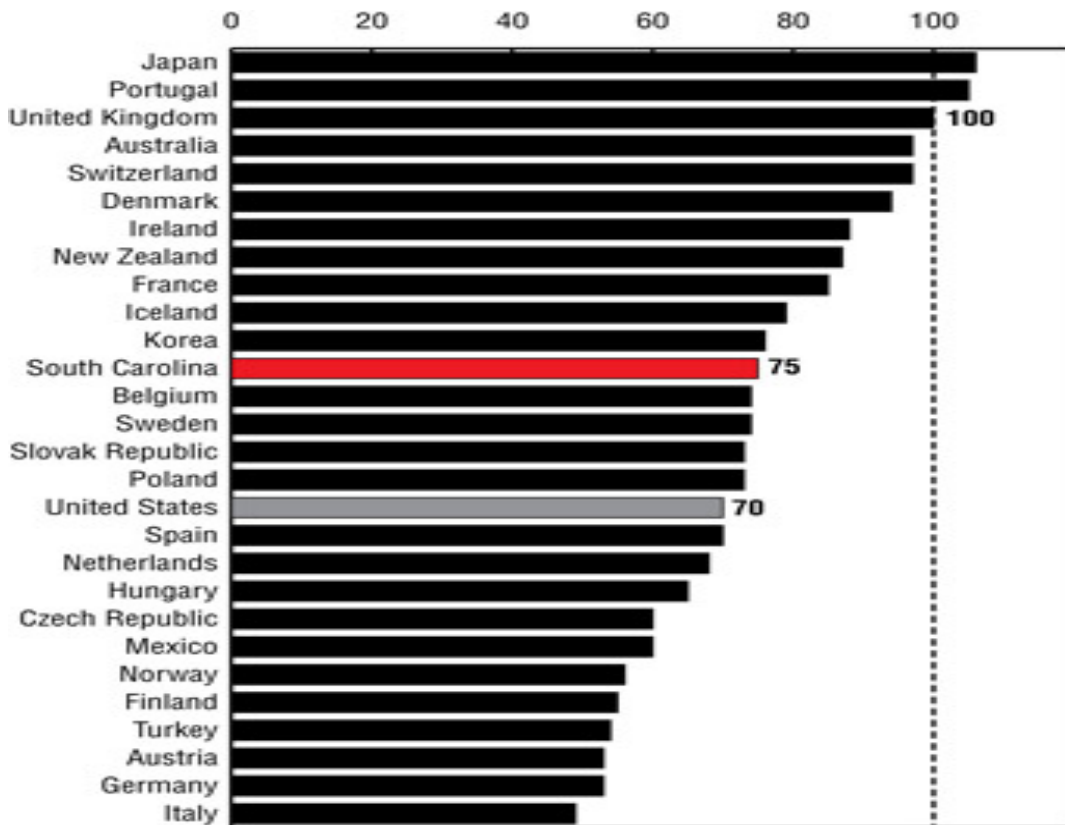


Figure 2. Total Degrees/Certificates Awarded Per 100 Students Enrolled, 2004

When compared internationally, South Carolina is surpassed by many countries in the proportion of students who complete certificates or degrees. With 18 out of 100 students enrolled completing a degree or certificate, South Carolina's completion rate is only 75% of the rate in the United Kingdom, the top-performing country on this measure, where 24 out of 100 students complete certificates or degrees. South Carolina also lags behind Japan, Portugal, Australia, Switzerland, Denmark, Ireland, New Zealand, France, Iceland, and Korea (see figure 2).

Internationally, the proportion of young adults, ages 25 to 34, with a college degree in South Carolina is only 70% of the proportion in Japan, the top-performing nation on this measure. South Carolina is also surpassed by Canada, Korea, Finland, Norway, Sweden, Belgium, Spain, France, and Ireland.

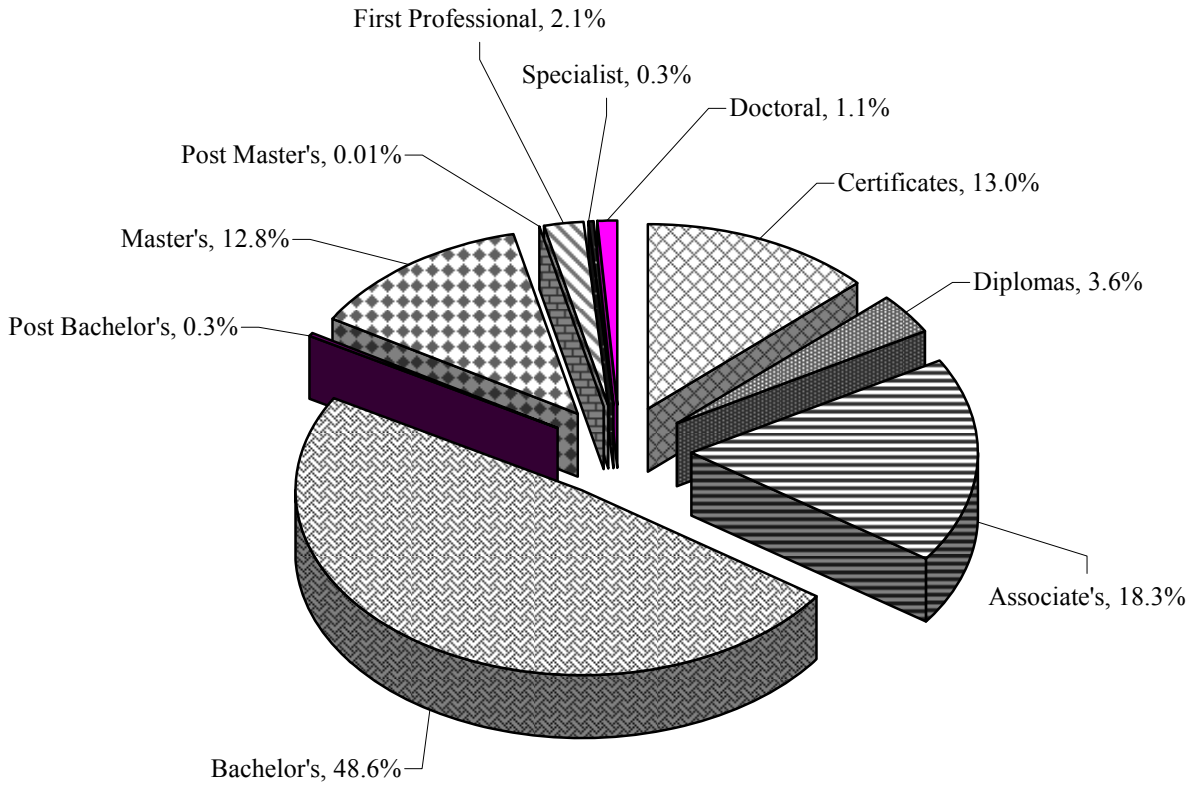

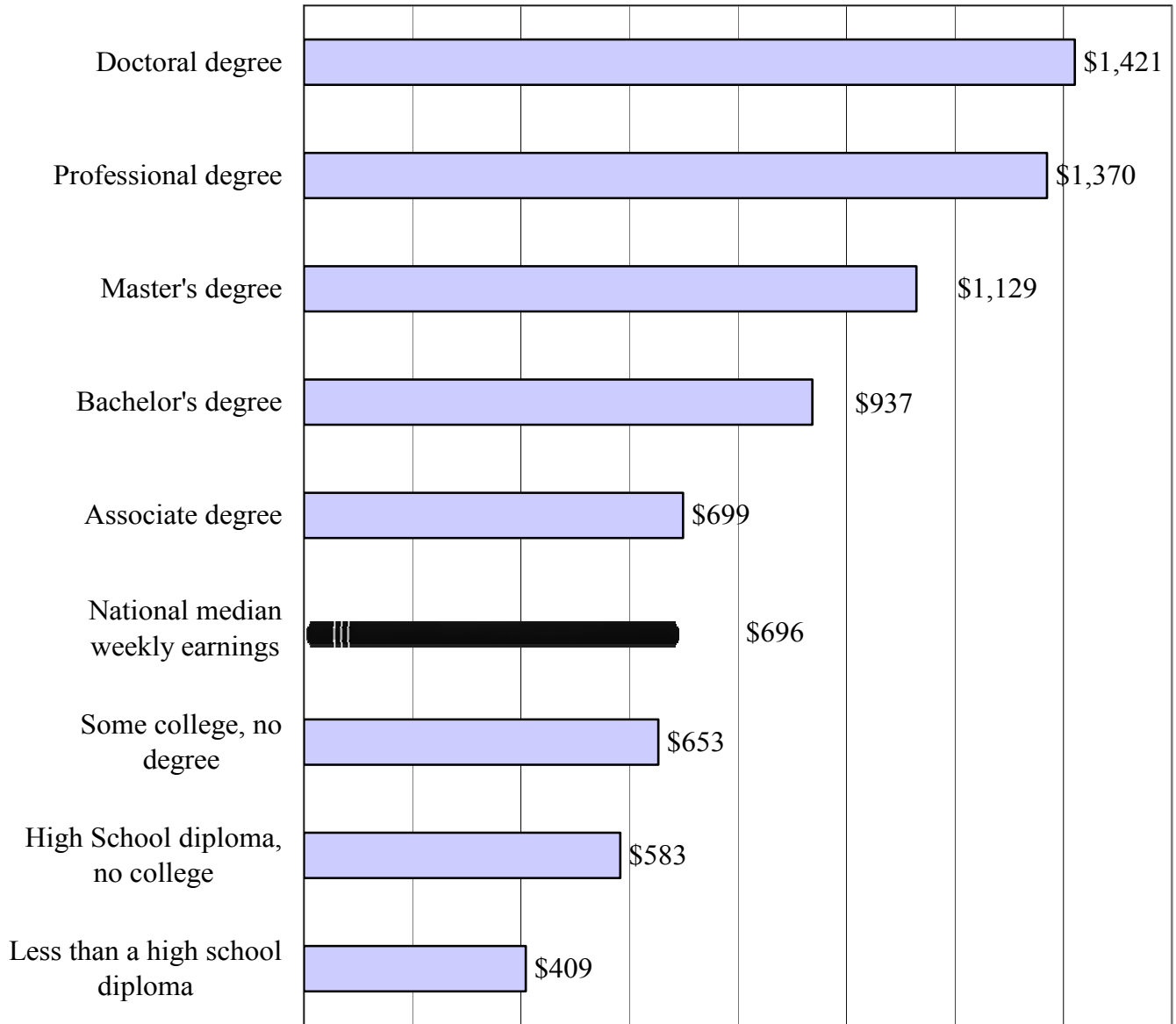

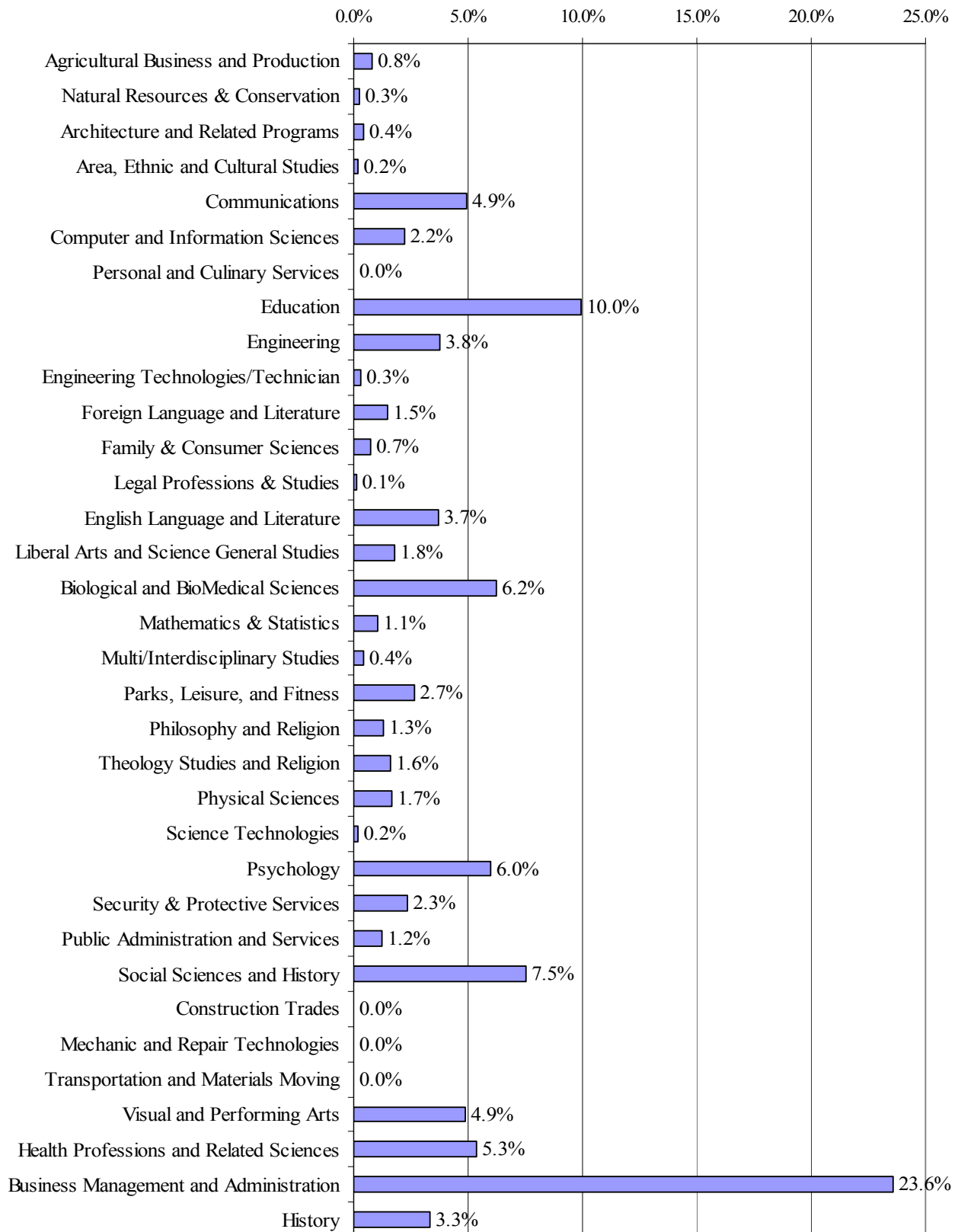

Graduation Rates

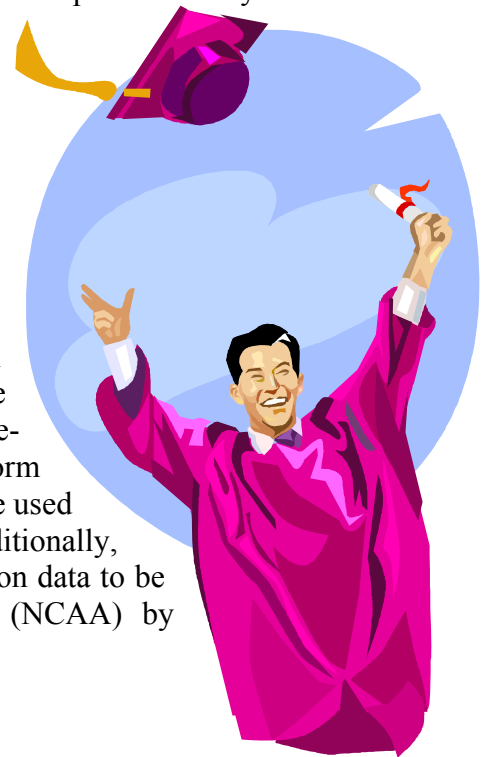


One of the most talked about educational indicators in South Carolina (and in the nation) is the “graduation rate” of a college or university. What is it exactly? How is it calculated? Why is it important? And perhaps, most importantly, what can this number, often expressed as a percent, tell us about quality at our colleges and universities?

First, it is important to understand that South Carolina originally devised the graduation rate calculation in response to a question raised by the South Carolina Legislature as part of ACT 255 of 1992. At that time, the Legislature wanted to know “How many years does it take for a first-time college student to graduate from a public college or university in South Carolina if the student goes to school full-time and does not change institutions?” All of the public colleges and universities met with the Commission on Higher Education and agreed upon a process to calculate a graduation rate, which in turn would answer this question.

The data has since been standardized on a national level. The National Center for Education Statistics (NCES), in its ongoing effort to report on the condition of postsecondary education in the United States, started an effort in 1997 to collect data on completion or graduation rates and transfer-out rates of full-time, first-time certificate or degree-seeking undergraduate students. This collection has been identified as the Graduation Rate Survey (GRS) and is a component of the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS).

“These data will provide comparable graduation rate statistics for all postsecondary institutions in the nation. The data will also provide much needed information to researchers as an institutional outcome measure, and it will offer insight into the relationship between the changing demographics of college-going cohorts within different types of institutions” (Form IPEDS-GRS-2, page 2). The information collected can also be used by institutions for the Student Right-to-Know Act. Additionally, cohort data has been added for athletes enabling this graduation data to be provided to the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) by NCES.

THE SAT PROGRAM

The SAT Reasoning Test™ (formerly known as the SAT® I: Reasoning Test) assesses student reasoning based on knowledge and skills developed by the students in their course work. The SAT Subject Tests™ (formerly known as SAT II: Subject Tests) are a series of one-hour, mostly multiple-choice tests that measure how much students know about a particular academic subject and how well they can apply that knowledge. Most students also complete the optional SAT Questionnaire (formerly known as the Student Descriptive Questionnaire) when they register to take SAT Program tests, providing valuable contextual information to aid in interpreting and understanding individual and group scores.



National SAT Snapshot

- 785,019 (54 percent) of SAT takers are female and 680,725 (46 percent) are male.
- Thirty-eight percent of SAT takers in the class of 2006 are minorities, up very slightly (0.2 percent) over last year, and the largest percentage of any class of SAT takers to date.
- Thirty-five percent of SAT takers are first-generation college students. Fifty-eight percent of first-generation college students are female. This female dominance is true for all the racial/ethnic groups.
- Females closed the combined gap with males from 42 to 26 points. The gap decreased in large part because of the addition of writing, in which females outperformed males by 11 points. Females also closed the gap in critical reading and held steady in math.
- There were greater declines in critical reading for males than for females across all ethnic groups. In addition, females outperformed males in writing across all ethnic groups.

Essay Subscores

- Fewer than 1 percent of students scored a 12.
- Average score was 7.2 out of 12.
- Females scored an average of 7.4 and males an average of 7.1
- Only 3 percent of essays needed to be resolved by a third reader.

A Look at a Random Sampling

- Only 8 percent of essays were identified as using the typical five-paragraph essays.
- Half of all essays were written in the first-person voice and received an average score of 6.9 versus 7.2 for all others.
- 15 percent of essays were written in cursive, while the other 85 percent were printed. Essays written in cursive received a slightly higher score (7.2 for cursive, compared to 7.0 for those printed).

Total - The number of 2006 South Carolina seniors taking the SAT (23,556) increased 0.29% from the previous year. However, the national number of test-takers decreased by 0.67%.

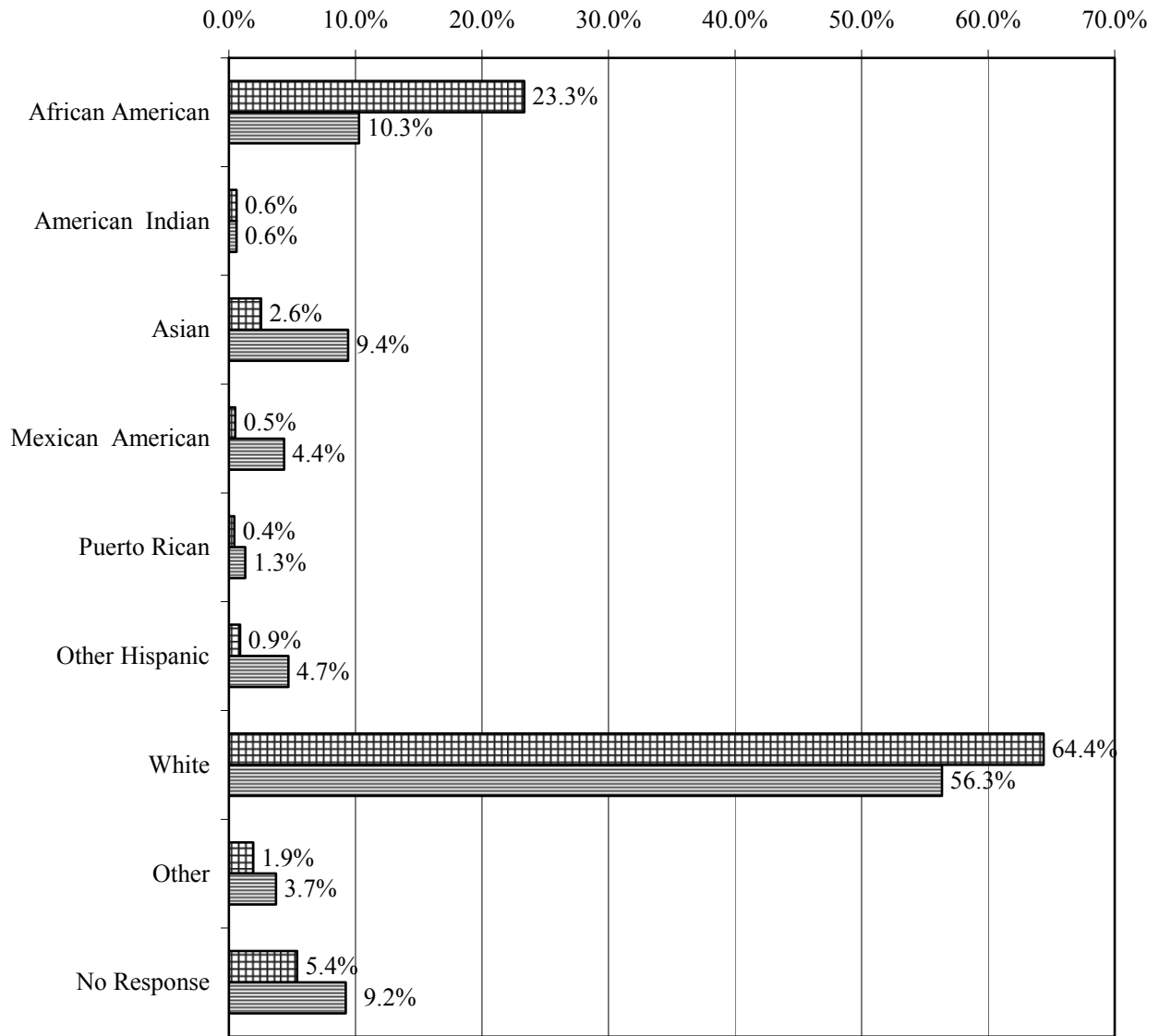
Mean Score - South Carolina's 2006 mean verbal score of 487 is seven points lower than the previous year's 494 while the national mean SAT verbal score of 503 decreased five points. South Carolina's 2006 mean math score of 498 is one point lower than the previous year's 499 while the national mean math score of 518 decreased two points from last year's score of 520.

Gender - Continuing the trend of previous years, the 2006 female SAT test-takers in South Carolina outnumbered the males. However, as the number of female test-takers increased this year (56%) the number of males decreased slightly (44%). This occurred at the national level also although at relatively smaller percentages, the female population at 53.6% and male population at 46.4%.

Ethnic - The 2006 SAT participation by ethnic group in South Carolina consists of 23.3% African Americans, 0.6% American-Indians, 2.6% Asians, 0.49% Mexican-Americans, 0.42% Puerto Ricans, 0.89% Other Hispanics, and 64.4% Whites, 1.9% Other, and 5.4% No Response. The national participation rate consists of 10.27% African Americans, 0.61% American-Indians, 9.44% Asians, 4.37% Mexican-Americans, 1.30% Puerto Ricans, 4.69% Other Hispanics, 56.35% Whites, 3.72% Other, and 9.23% No Response.

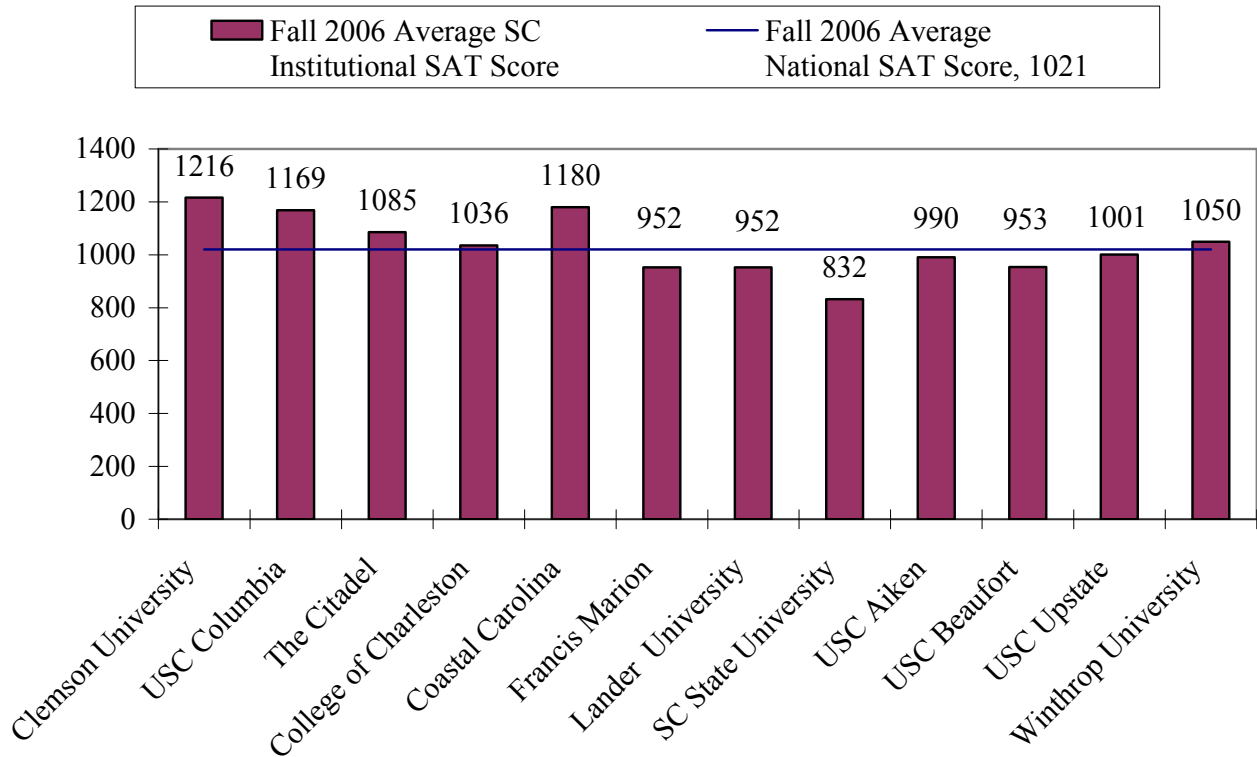

TUITION, COST, GRANTS

Glossary

Application Fee – The amount of money that an institution charges for processing a student’s application for admittance to the institution. This amount is not creditable toward tuition or required fees, nor is it refundable if the student is not admitted to the institution.

Board Charges – The charge for an academic year for meals for a specified number of days (or meals) per week.

Books and Supplies – The average cost of books and supplies for a typical student for an entire academic year (or program).

Dormitory Capacity – The maximum number of students for which the institution can provide dormitory housing facilities for, whether on or off campus.

MRR – Mission Resource Requirement. This is the formula used by the Commission on Higher Education in determining institutional operating and general funding needs. See page 111.

Room Charges – The charges for an academic year for rooming accommodations of a typical student sharing a room with one other student.

Tuition – Amount of money charged to students for instructional services. Tuition may be charged per term, per course, or per credit.

Required Fees – Fixed sum charged to students for items not covered by tuition and required of such a large proportion of all students that the student who does NOT pay is an exception.

In-District Student – A student who is a legal resident of the locality in which he/she attends school and thus is entitled to reduced tuition charges if offered by the institution.

In-State Student – A student who pays in-state rates in accordance with Section 59-112 of the 1976 SC Code of Laws, as amended.

Out-of-State Student – A student who pays the out-of-state rate in accordance with Section 59-112 of the 1976 SC Code of Laws, as amended.

Measuring Up – The National Report Card on Higher Education Affordability

South Carolina has lost ground in providing affordable higher education

- Compared with best-performing states, families in South Carolina devote a very large share of family income, even after financial aid, to attend public two- and four-year colleges and universities, which enroll 83% of college students in the state.
- The state's investment in need-based financial aid is very low when compared with top-performing states, and the state does not offer low-priced college opportunities.
- Undergraduate students borrowed on average \$3,614 in 2005.

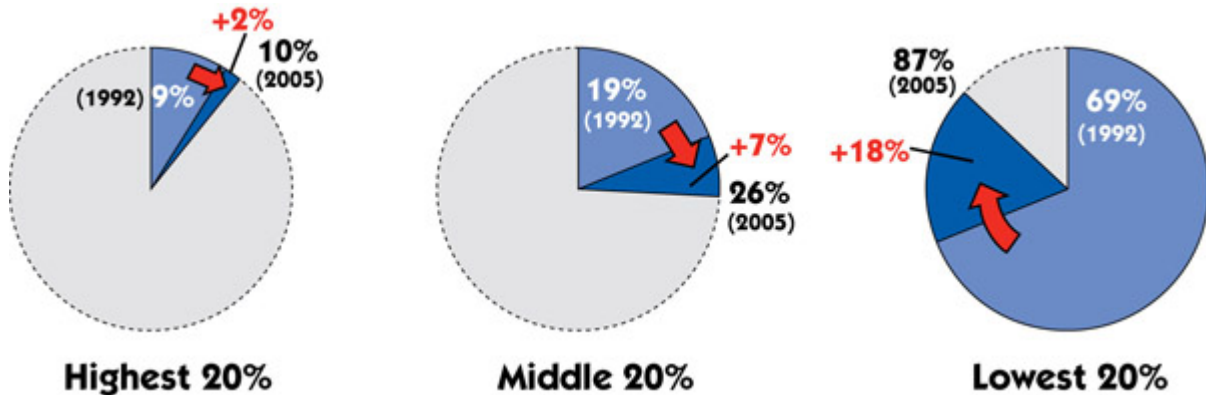
Change In Graded Measures

Over the past several years, the share of family income, even after financial aid, needed to pay for college expenses at public four-year institutions has increased from 28% to 36%.

Statewide Scholarships and Grants

Administered by the S.C. Commission on Higher Education

Palmetto Fellows Scholarship

The Palmetto Fellows Scholarship is a merit-based scholarship program that was established in 1988 to recognize the most academically talented high school seniors in S.C. and encourage them to attend college in the State. Each Palmetto Fellow may receive a scholarship of up to \$6,700 annually, less any other gift aid received. The scholarship must be applied toward the cost of attendance for a maximum of eight full-time terms of study toward the first bachelor's degree at a participating senior institution in S.C. Students receiving the Palmetto Fellows Scholarship cannot also be a recipient of the LIFE, S.C. HOPE scholarships or Lottery Tuition Assistance. In order to submit an application during the high school senior year, students must meet one of the following two academic requirements:

1. Score at least 1200 on the SAT (27 on the ACT) by the June test administration, earn a minimum 3.50 cumulative GPA on the S.C. Uniform Grading Scale (UGS), and rank in the top six percent of the class; or
2. Score at least 1400 on the SAT (32 on the ACT) by the June test administration and earn a minimum 4.00 cumulative GPA on the S.C.UGS.

To renew the Palmetto Fellows Scholarship, students must earn 30 credit hours each academic year and a cumulative 3.0 grade point average for graduation purposes.

Legislative Incentives for Future Excellence (LIFE) Scholarship

The LIFE Scholarship Program is a merit-based program that was established in 1998 to provide incentives for students to be better prepared for college and to increase access to higher education. Students attending an eligible two-year or technical institution may receive up to the cost-of-tuition plus a \$300 book allowance each academic year (the two-year independent institution may award up to the average cost-of-tuition at the State's two-year regional campuses). Students attending an eligible four-year institution may receive up to \$4,700, not to exceed cost-of-attendance, plus a \$300 book allowance each academic year.

In order to qualify, first-time entering freshmen attending a two-year or technical college must earn a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA, based on the S.C. Uniform Grading Scale at the end of the senior year of high school.

In order to qualify at a four-year institution, first-time entering freshmen must meet two of the following three criteria:

- (1) minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale, based on the S.C. UGS
- (2) 1100 SAT/24 ACT
- (3) Rank in the top 30% of graduating class based on UGS

Continued Eligibility:

Students must meet the following criteria to renew eligibility for the LIFE Scholarship:

- (1) Continue to meet all eligibility requirements as stated in regulations under "Student Eligibility";
- (2) Earn at least a 3.0 "LIFE GPA" by the end of the academic year; and
- (3) Meet the average 30 annual credit hour requirement (or its equivalent) by the end of the academic year based on initial college enrollment:
 - (a) earn a minimum of 30 (or the equivalent) credit hours if entering the second year; or
 - (b) earn a minimum of 60 (or the equivalent) credit hours if entering the third year; or
 - (c) earn a minimum of 90 (or the equivalent) credit hours if entering the fourth year; or
 - (d) earn a minimum of 120 (or its equivalent) credit hours if entering the fifth year of an approved five-year bachelor's degree program.

Students may receive a LIFE Scholarship for a maximum of two terms for a one-year certificate or diploma program; four terms for an associate's degree program or a two-year program that is acceptable for full credit toward a baccalaureate degree; eight terms for a baccalaureate degree; or 10 terms for a CHE approved five-year baccalaureate degree program.

S.C. HOPE Scholarship

The S.C. HOPE Scholarship is a merit-based scholarship that was established under the 2001 S.C. Education Lottery Act and implemented in fall 2002. The scholarship was created to provide funding for students attending an eligible four-year institution in S.C. who do not qualify for a LIFE or Palmetto Fellows Scholarship. Funding for this program is dependent upon lottery proceeds. Students may receive up to \$2,500 plus a \$150 book allowance toward the cost-of-attendance for the first year of attendance only. In order to qualify, first-time entering freshmen must have earned a cumulative 3.0 GPA based on the S.C. Uniform Grading Scale upon high school graduation and not be a recipient of the LIFE or Palmetto Fellows scholarship.

The S.C.HOPE Scholarship is only for the freshman year. The student can then qualify for the LIFE scholarship, if he or she meets the continuing eligibility requirements. (see LIFE scholarship above under continued eligibility).

Lottery Tuition Assistance

The Lottery Tuition Assistance Program was established under the 2001 S.C. Education Lottery Act and implemented during the fall 2002 term. Since funding for the program is dependent upon lottery proceeds and the number of eligible students, the actual award amount is determined on a term-by-term basis. Each academic year, students must meet the following minimum requirements in order to be eligible:

- Be a S.C. resident;
- Be enrolled in at least six credit hours each term as a degree-seeking student at an eligible two-year S.C. institution;
- Make satisfactory academic progress toward the completion of the degree requirements;
- Must not owe a refund or repayment on any federal/state aid or be in default on any student loans;
- File the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA); or complete the FAFSA Waiver
- Must not be eligible for or a recipient of a LIFE, Palmetto Fellows, or S.C.HOPE Scholarship during the same academic year.

To renew Lottery Tuition Assistance, students must earn a cumulative 2.0 GPA after attempting 24 credit hours.

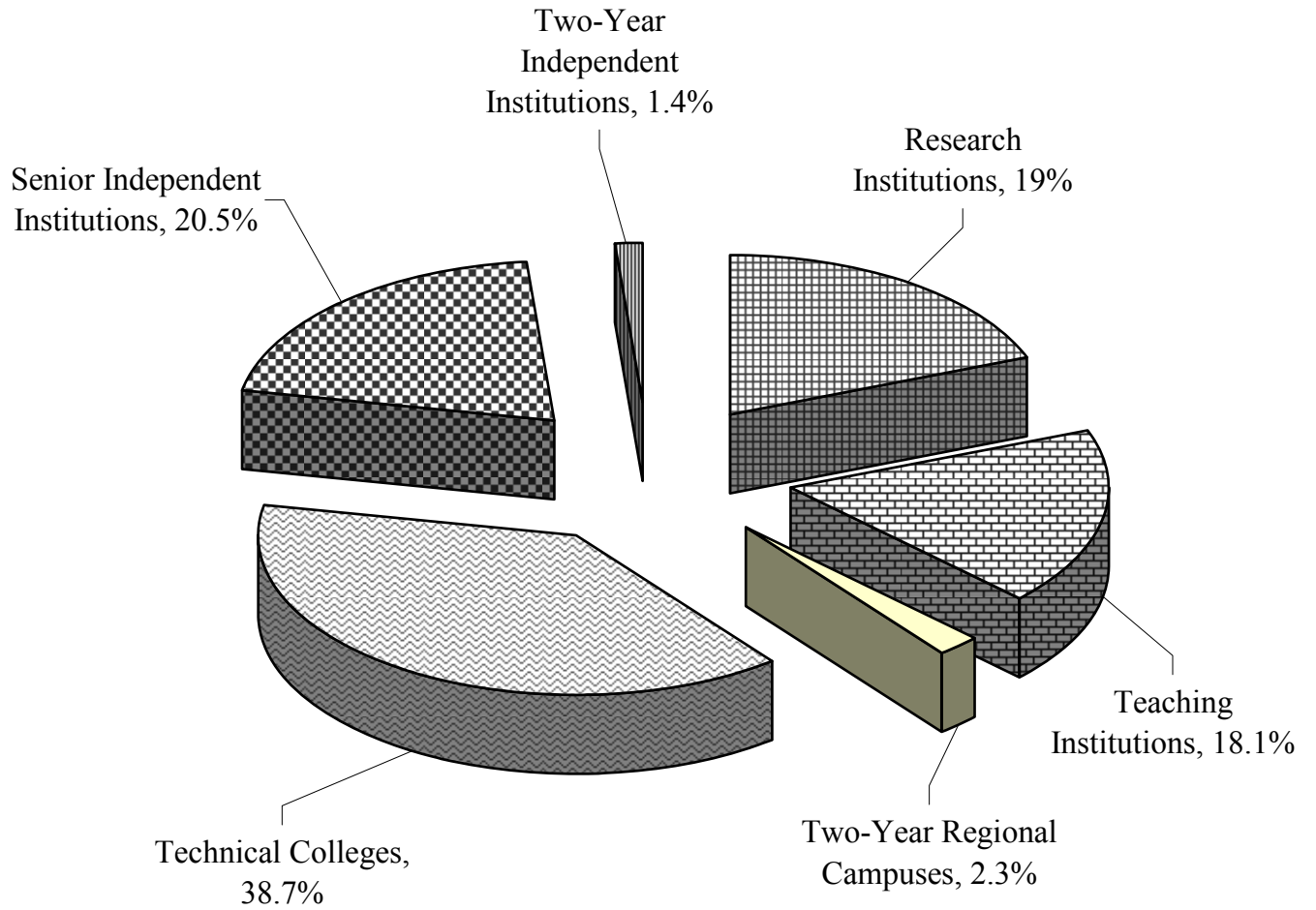
High school students participating in dual enrollment courses at approved two-year institutions are eligible to receive funding from Lottery Tuition Assistance. Students must complete the FAFSA waiver and be enrolled in a minimum of six credit hours.

S.C. Need-based Grants

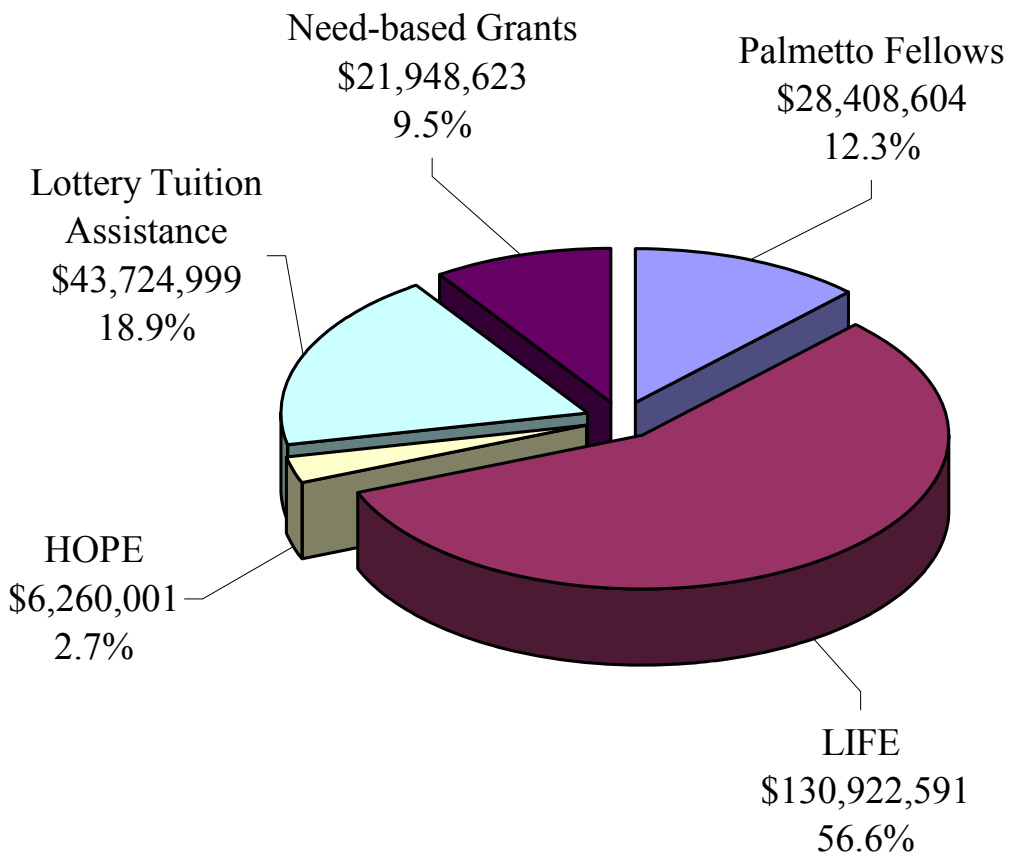
The S.C. Need-based Grants Program was established in 1996 to provide financial assistance to the state's neediest students. Students may receive up to \$2,500 annually if enrolled full-time and up to \$1,250 annually if enrolled part-time at S.C. public institutions. Based upon the results of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Form, the institution at which the student is enrolled determines the exact award amount, less any other gift aid received. The Grant must be applied directly toward the cost-of-attendance for a maximum of eight full-time equivalent terms.

To renew a Need-based Grant, students must earn a requisite number of credit hours based upon their enrollment status and earn a cumulative 2.0 grade point average.

Glossary

Academic Support - Funds to provide support services for an institution's primary missions - instruction, research, and public services.

Allocation - An authorization to incur obligations and to make expenditures during a stated period of time, for a specified purpose, and not to exceed the amount provided in the authorization.

Appropriation - A legislative authorization that permits government agencies to incur obligations and to make payments out of the treasury for specified purposes. An appropriation usually follows enactment of authorizing legislation. An appropriation act is the most common means of providing budget authority, but in some cases, the authorizing legislation itself provides the budget authority.

Auxiliary Enterprise - An entity that exists to furnish goods or services to students, faculty, or staff, and that charges a fee directly related to, although not necessarily equal to, the cost of the goods or service.

Below-the-line-Funding - Funds appropriated to the institution that are in addition to those generated by CHE Formula/MRR methodology. (Also see CHE Formula/MRR definition below)

Budget - A plan for the accomplishment, within a definite time period, of programs related to established objectives and goals, setting forth estimates of the resources required and the resources available (usually in comparison with one or more past periods) and showing future requirements. Also, a request for funds to pay the operating cost of the government.

Capital Budget - A budget that deals with large expenditures for capital items normally financed by borrowing. Usually, capital items have long-range returns and useful life spans, are relatively expensive, and have physical presence (buildings, roads, and sewage systems).

CHE Formula or Mission Resource Requirement (MRR) - A numerical mechanism used to determine funding needs (costs), CHE recommendations to the legislation for funding, and to provide for equitable sharing of state available resources, of public higher education institutions. Also see page 89 for reference to MRR.

Debt Service - All payments in connection with funds borrowed by an institution, e.g., principal payments, interest payments, payments to reserve and to ensure proper upkeep and maintenance of the facilities, trustees' service charges, legal expenses and other items related to indebtedness.

Earmarked Revenue - Funds from a specific source to be spent only for a designated activity.

Expenditures - The cost of goods delivered or services rendered, whether actually paid or unpaid, for the operation of an institution and for addition to its plants or payment of an obligation.

Full Funding - Provision of budgetary resources to cover the total cost of a program or project at the time it is undertaken.

Incremental Funding - The provision or recording of budgetary resources for a program or project based on obligations estimated to be incurred within a fiscal year when such budgetary resources will cover only a portion of the obligations to be incurred in completing the program or project.

Institutional Support - Central executive-level activities concerned with management and long-range planning of the entire institution, such as the governing board, planning and programming, legal services, etc.

Line-Item Budget - A budget format that presents the exact amount planned to be spent for every separate good or service to be purchased.

Operating Budget - The current year budget that guides agencies' everyday activities.

Public Service - An activity that is established primarily to provide non-instructional services beneficial to individuals and groups external to the institution.

Research - Systemic, intensive study directed toward fuller scientific knowledge or understanding of the subject studied.

Restricted Current Funds - Resources provided to an institution that have externally established limitations or stipulations placed on their use. Externally imposed restrictions are to be contrasted with internal designations imposed by the governing board on unrestricted funds.

Revenues - Revenues result from: the rendering of services and is measured by the charge made therefore to the students, sponsors, and others; gains from the sale or exchange of current fund assets; interest and dividends earned on investments; sale of goods; and other increases arising from or for the support of current fund operations, for example, gift, gifts applied, and appropriations.

Student Services - Offices of admissions and registrar and those activities whose primary purpose is to contribute to the student's emotional and physical well-being and to his or her intellectual, cultural, and social development outside the context of the formal instruction program.

Unrestricted Current Funds - Resources received by an institution that have no limitations or stipulations placed on them by external agencies or donors.

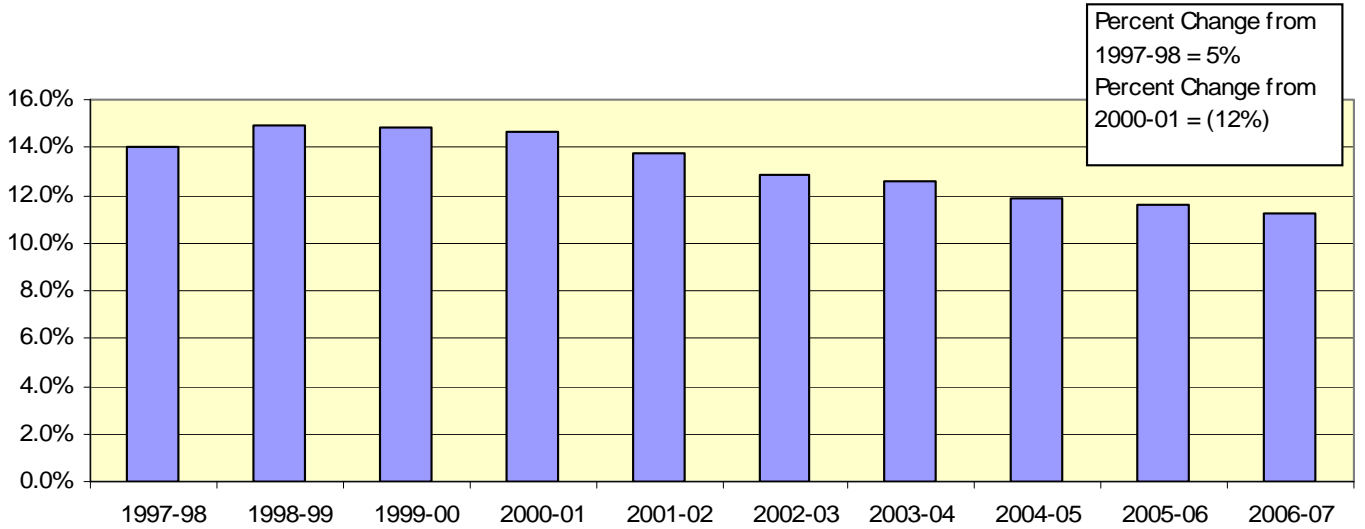

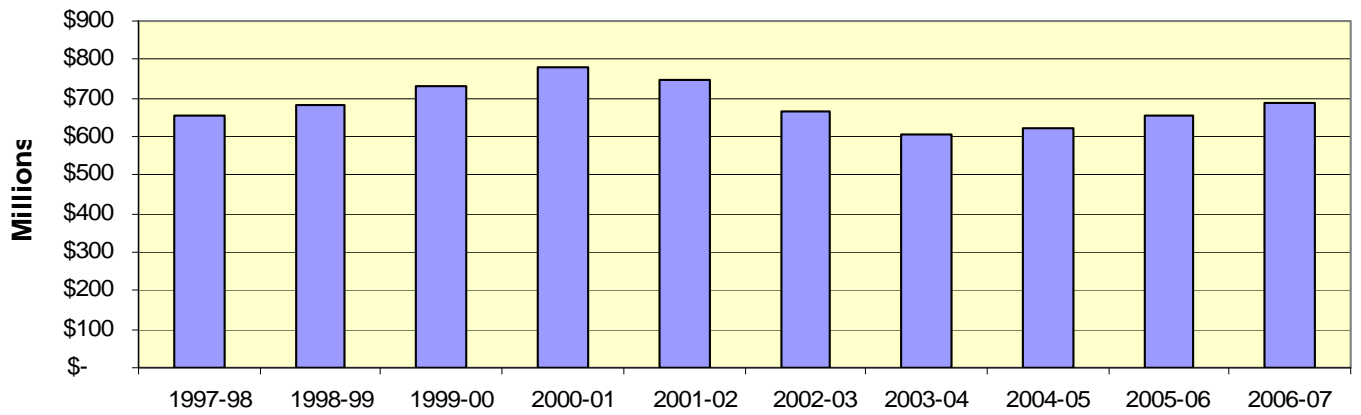

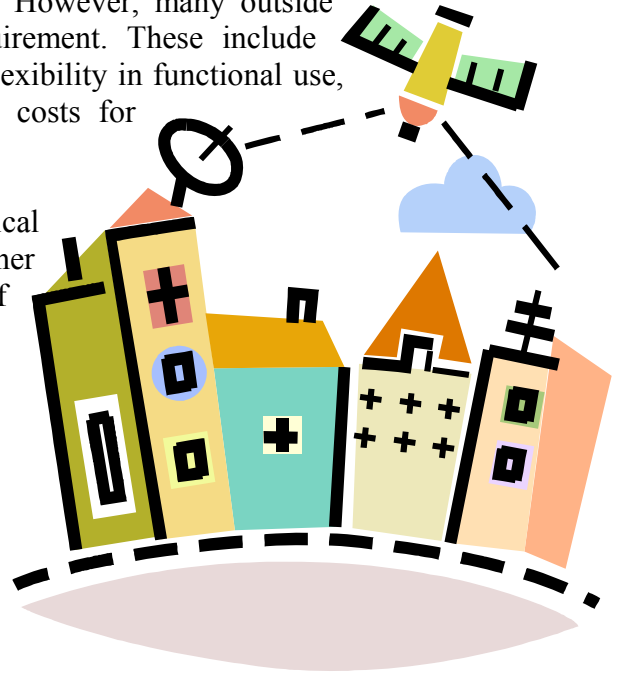

FACILITIES OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

Colleges and universities conduct a wide range of activities in pursuit of their missions as institutions of higher education. The physical facilities of an educational institution affect all segments of the institution and must effectively provide the level of service necessary to support the institution's objectives in fulfilling its mission.

The degree to which each institution's facilities fulfill any or all of the functions necessary to its mission depends in a large measure on the goals of the institution, its size, and the availability of resources. An institution's facilities must be adequate to serve the programmatic needs of the institution. However, many outside factors often conflict with this overriding requirement. These include changing enrollment patterns, which necessitate flexibility in functional use, proliferation of codes and standards, increasing costs for operation and maintenance, and austere funding.

The effective allocation and utilization of physical facilities is essential if an institution of higher education is to meet its objectives in the areas of instruction, research, and public service.



FACILITIES

Glossary

Academic Support - Funds to provide support services for an institution's primary missions – instruction, research, and public services.

Accessible Area - An indication that a room can be approached, entered, and used, without assistance, by a mobility-impaired person. The United States Department of Education Section 504 Subpart C regulation states “no qualified individual with a disability shall be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity because a recipient’s facilities are inaccessible to, or unusable by, persons with disabilities.”

Assignable Area - The sum of all areas on all floors of a building assigned to, or available for assignment to, an occupant or use, excluding spaces defined as building service, circulation, mechanical, and structural areas.

Auxiliary Enterprises - Activities that exist to furnish goods or services to students, faculty, or staff, and that charge a fee directly related to, although not necessarily equal to, the cost of the goods or services are included in auxiliary enterprises. These entities are classified as self-supporting.

Educational and General (E&G) - Space used for the educational and general operations of an institution, including instruction, research, public service, academic support, student services, institutional support, operation and maintenance of physical plant, etc.

Hospitals - Activities associated with the patient care operations of a hospital. This category does not include instructional activities which may take place in the hospital but which are more appropriately categorized in the instruction program.

Independent Operations - Institutional activities that are owned by or controlled by the institution but that are independent of, or unrelated to the institution's mission

Institutional Support - Activities carried out to provide for both the day-to-day functioning and the long-range viability of the institution as an operating organization. The ultimate goal of the institutional support program is to provide for the institution's organizational effectiveness and continuity

Instruction - Activities carried out for the express purpose of eliciting a measure of educational change in a learner or group of learners.

Physical Plant Operations - Activities related to maintaining existing facilities and grounds, providing utility services, and planning and designing future plant expansions and modifications.

Public Service - Activities established to make available to the public the various resources and capabilities of the institution for the specific purpose of responding to a community need or solving a community problem.

Research - Any activity intended to produce one or more research outcomes – including the creation of knowledge, the organization of knowledge, and the application of knowledge. A research activity may be conducted with institutional funds or under the terms of an agreement with an agency external to the institution.

Glossary

Room Hours of Instruction - The number of hours each week that a classroom is used for regularly scheduled classes.

Space Factor Calculation - A very useful calculation for facilities planners, in that it combines into a single factor the concepts of weekly room hours, percent student station utilization, and assignable square feet per student station. The lower the space factor, the more effectively the space is being utilized for instructional purposes. The calculation is: the average student station size (SF per student station) divided by the average week room hours of instruction multiplied by the station utilization percentage.

Station Utilization Percentage - Indicates the average percentage of student stations that are occupied when classrooms or class laboratories are in use. It is calculated by dividing the student clock hours generated in classrooms (or class labs) by the potential student clock hours for classrooms (or class labs) and multiplying by 100 to convert to a percentage. Potential student clock hours are computed on a room-by-room basis by multiplying the number of student stations in each room by the room hours of instruction generated by the room. It indicates the number of student clock hours which would be generated if every room were filled to capacity (i.e., if the number of students equaled the number of stations) each time a course met in the room.

Student Services - Activities that contribute to the emotional and physical well-being of the students, as well as to their intellectual, cultural, and social development outside of the context of the institution's formal instruction program.

Student Station - A desk, table/chair, theatre seating, etc., used by the student in the classroom or class laboratory.

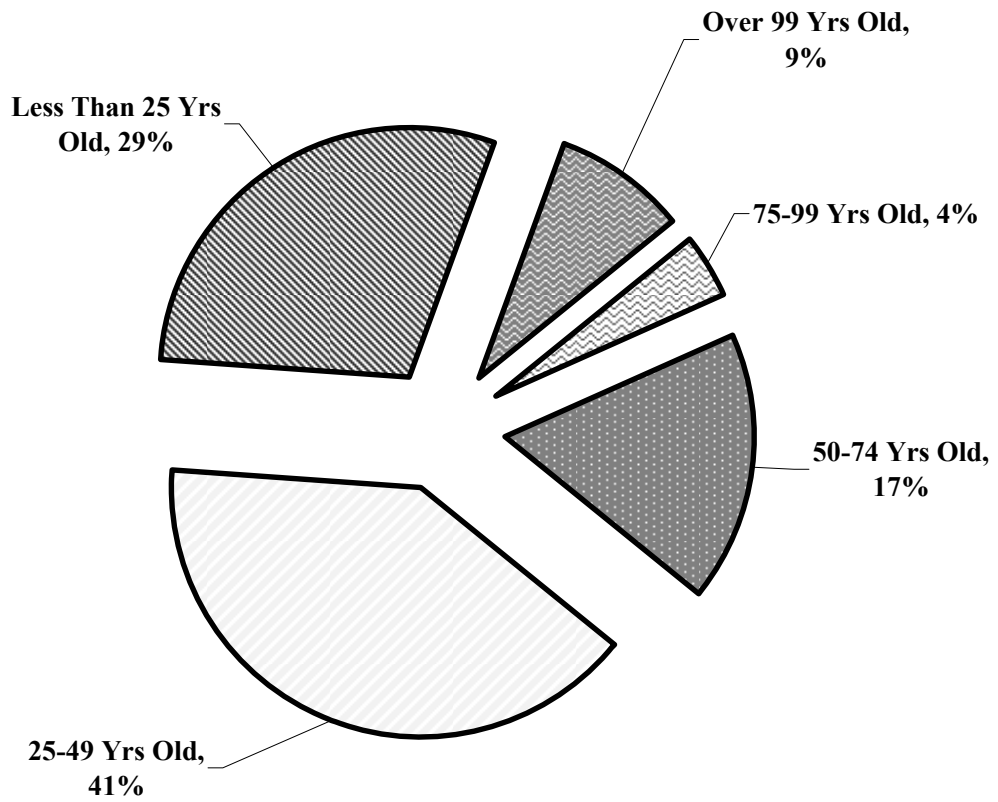

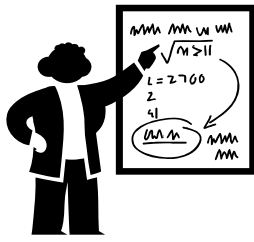

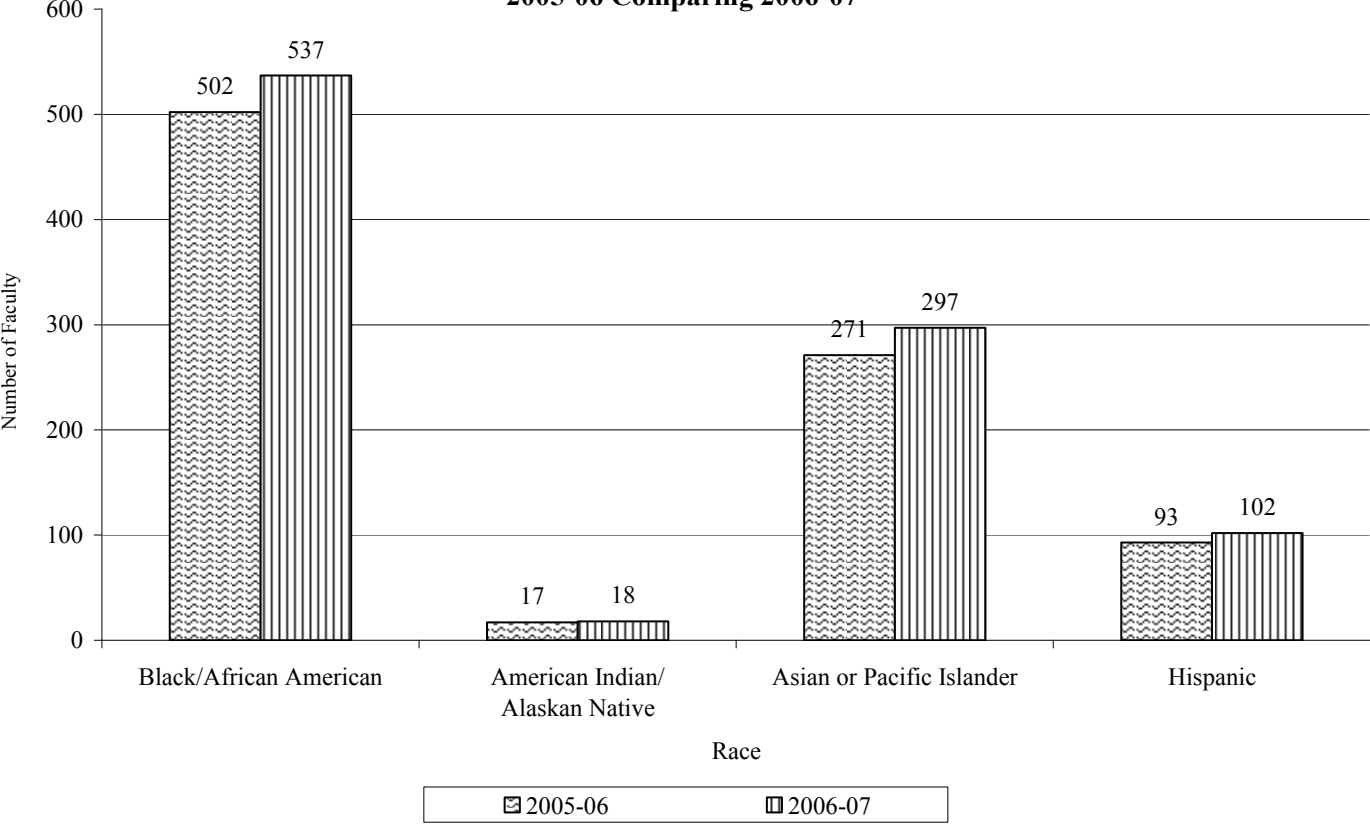

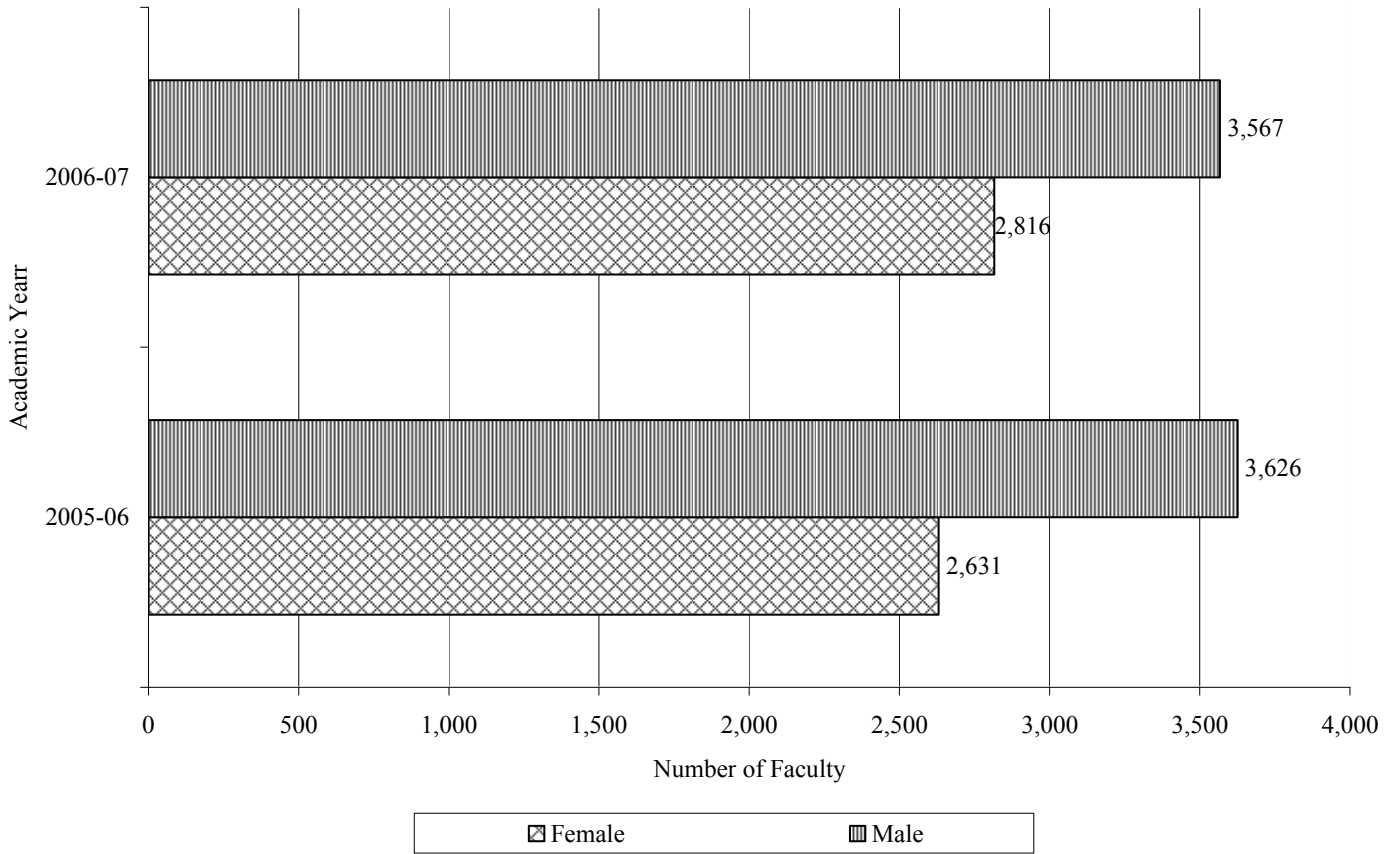

Appendix 1

Performance Funding In South Carolina A Brief History and Background

Act 359 of 1996 amended sections of the South Carolina State code relating to the Commission on Higher Education (in particular Section 59-103-5, *et seq.*) to dramatically change the mechanism for determining state funding of public higher education. The legislation mandated that the Commission, in consultation with institutions and other key stakeholders, develop and use a performance system for determining institutional funding. The law specified that the quality of higher education institutions could be measured by considering nine critical success factors with 37 indicators suggested to measure those nine areas, and provided a three-year phase-in period to develop a system that would base all funding of public higher education in South Carolina on performance.

To meet its mandate, the Commission on Higher Education (CHE) developed a two-part plan: 1) a determination of financial need for the institutions – resulting in the Mission Resource Requirement (MRR) to identify the total amount of money an institution should receive based on comparable costs for institutions of similar mission, size and complexity of programs and 2) an evaluation process whereby each institution’s performance on identified measures is rated and funding is allocated contingent on the ratings. Developed in 1996-97 and substantially revised in 1999, the plan was phased in over time so that by the third year, as required, an assessment of performance on all indicators as listed in law (§59-103-30(B)) determined all general operating funding.

The Commission has continued to work with the 33 public institutions in South Carolina to refine and improve the system since its inception. In FY99, a change in scoring provided for ratings on each performance indicator to be on a 3-point scale rather than the 6-point scale. Additionally, institutions were rated by category rather than a percent score. Many of the indicator measurement definitions have changed since they were first defined in 1996 and 1997 with most such changes occurring in FY00. In FY01, the method for identifying the standards used to determine performance changed from a system whereby each institution negotiated its own benchmarks to one where standards were determined for sectors of institutions based on available national, state and regional data and peer data. During that same year, the Commission added a component to the three-point indicator scoring scale to provide recognition of individual institutional improvement over past years. The last significant revision occurred effective in FY02 and involved a reduction in the number of indicators used in determining overall institutional performance from 37 to 13 or 14 key indicators. The remaining indicators were identified by the Commission working in consultation with institutions and other key stakeholders as those that had proven to be most informative and useful in assessing performance and were best reflective of sector and institutional missions. Recent budget and policy changes have frozen the system in place, with scoring largely deferred pending policy decisions. Data collection has continued as necessary to meet state and federal legislative mandates.

The Commission publication “Performance Funding Workbook: A Guide to SC’s Performance Funding System for Public Higher Education” provides the latest details on SC’s performance funding system and measures used in determining performance. This publication and additional details are available on the Commission’s website www.che.sc.gov under “Data and Publications.”

Types of Public Institutions in South Carolina by Mission

Changes to the SC State Code of Laws, 1976, as amended, arising from Act 359 of 1996, set forth missions of public higher education, as well as, for each type of public institution in the state. (Sections 59-103-15 (A) and 59-103-15(B)). These statements are excerpted and printed below. In performance funding, applicable measures are determined by sector.

Mission Identified for Higher Education in South Carolina:

The General Assembly has determined that the mission for higher education in South Carolina is to be a global leader in providing a coordinated, comprehensive system of excellence in education by providing instruction, research, and life-long learning opportunities which are focused on economic development and benefit the State of South Carolina.

Goals to be achieved through this mission are identified and include: high academic quality; affordable and accessible education; instructional excellence; coordination and cooperation with public education; cooperation among the General Assembly, Commission on Higher Education, Council of Presidents of State Institutions, institutions of higher learning, and the business community; economic growth; and clearly defined missions.

Mission Identified for Types of Sectors of SC Higher Education are:

Research institutions

- college-level baccalaureate education, master's, professional, and doctor of philosophy degrees which lead to continued education or employment;
- research through the use of government, corporate, nonprofit-organization grants, or state resources, or both;
- public service to the State and the local community.

Four-year colleges and universities

- college-level baccalaureate education and selected master's degrees which lead to employment or continued education, or both, except for doctoral degrees currently being offered;
- limited and specialized research;
- public service to the State and the local community.

Two-year institutions - branches of the University of South Carolina

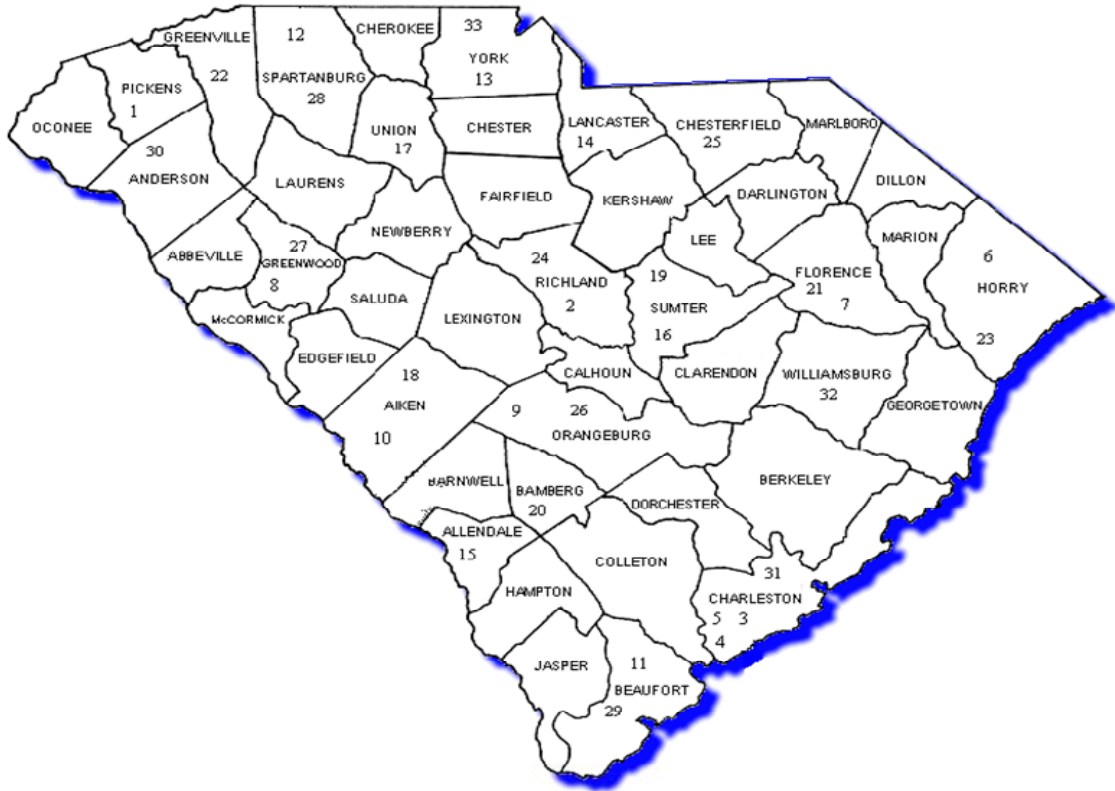
- college-level pre-baccalaureate education necessary to confer associate's degrees which lead to continued education at a four-year or research institution;
- public service to the State and the local community.

State technical and comprehensive education system

- all post-secondary vocational, technical, and occupational diploma and associate degree programs leading directly to employment or maintenance of employment and associate degree programs which enable students to gain access to other post-secondary education;
- up-to-date and appropriate occupational and technical training for adults;
- special school programs that provide training for prospective employees for prospective and existing industry in order to enhance the economic development of South Carolina;
- public service to the State and the local community;
- continue to remain technical, vocational, or occupational colleges with a mission as stated herein and primarily focused on technical education and the economic development of the State.

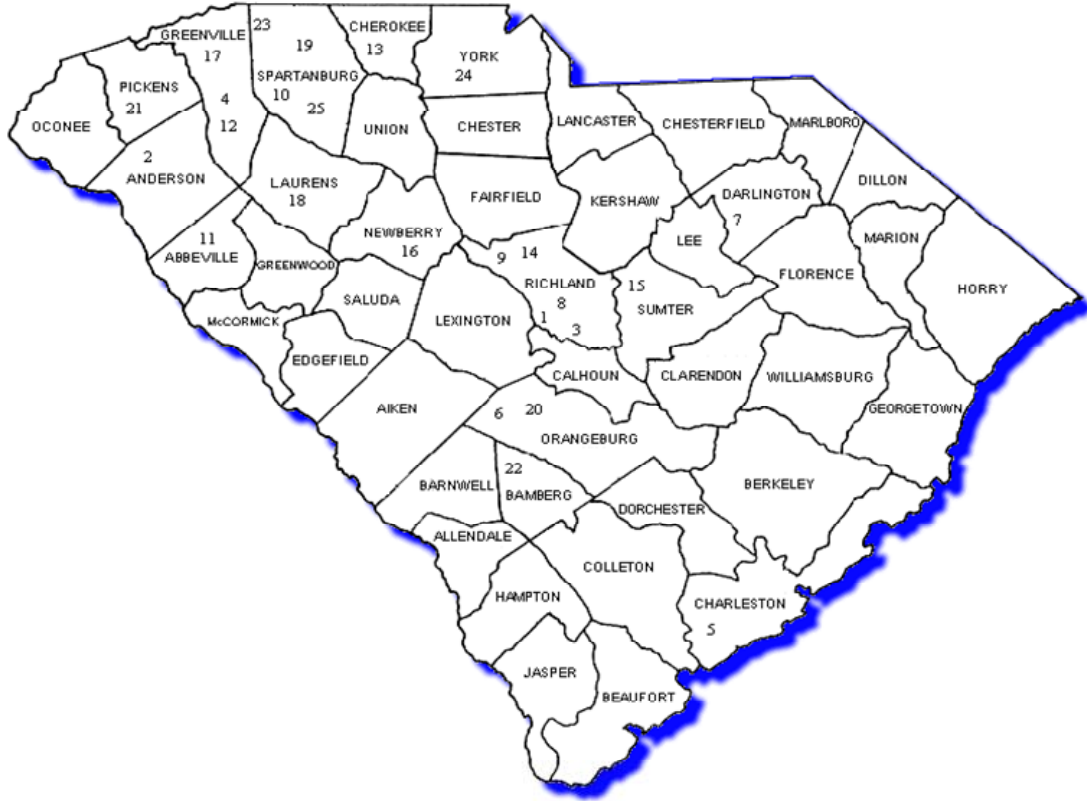

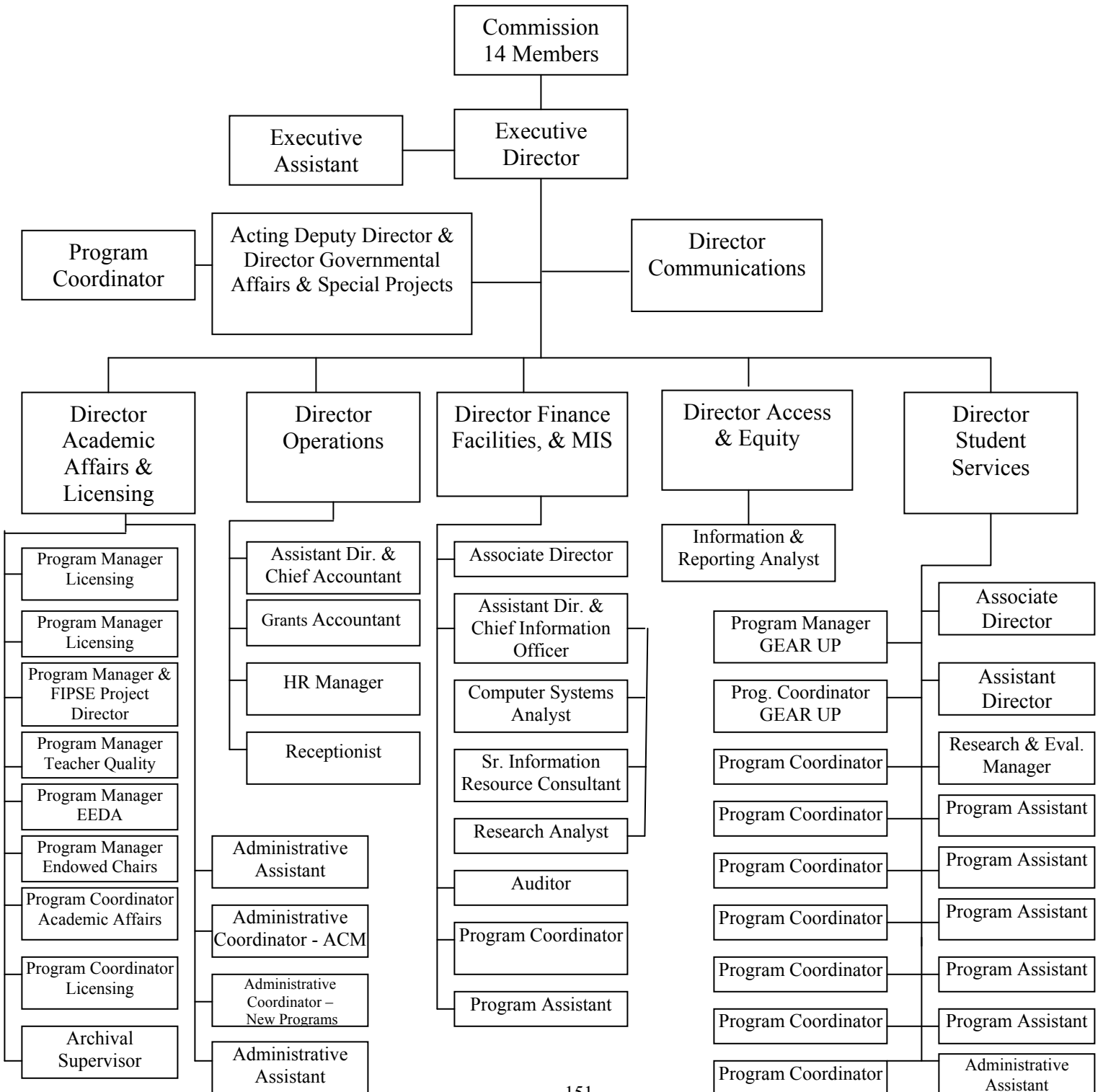
